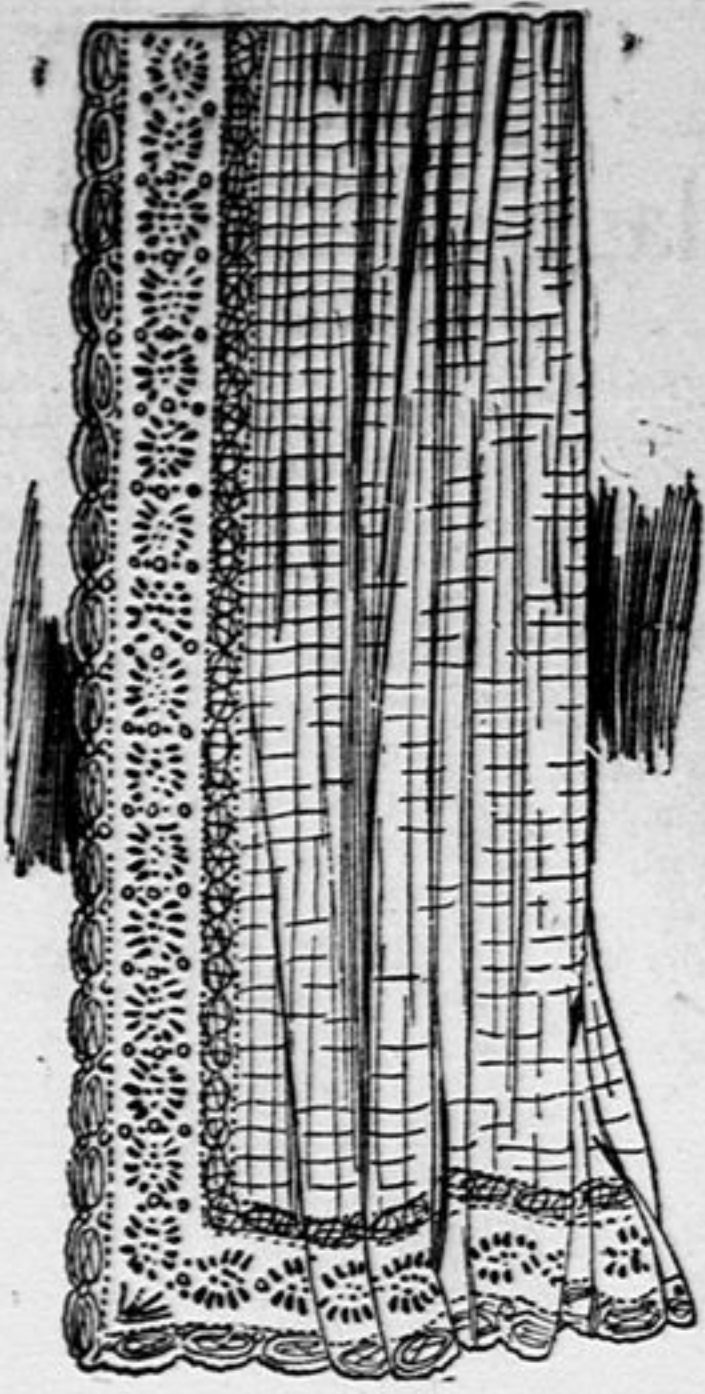

Easter Visitors at Little Britain

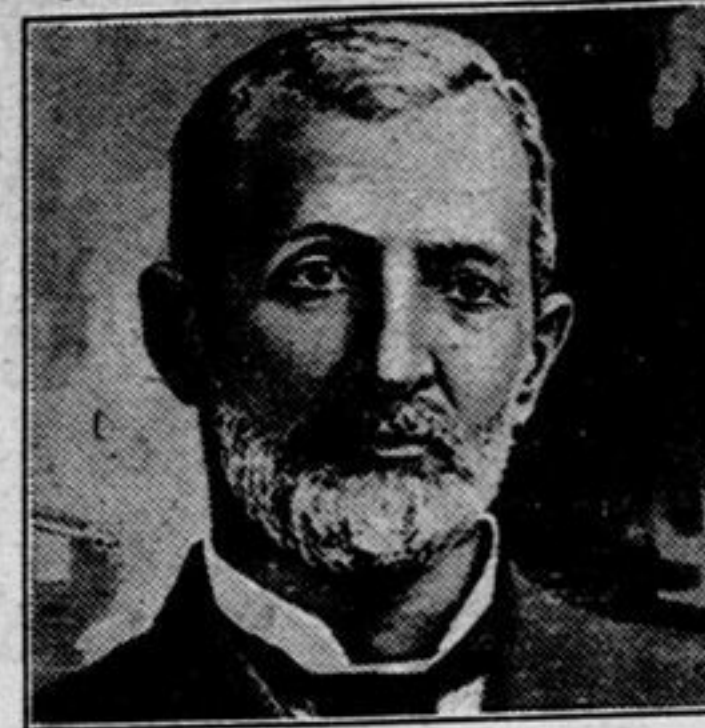

Lesson IV.—Second Quarter, For April 23, 1911.

THE INTERNATIONAL SERIES.

Text of the Lesson, II Kings xii, 4-15. Memory Verse, 11—Golden Text, I Chron. xxix, 9—Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

Today we combine the story of Joash, king of Judah, in last week's lesson and in this one. He began to reign in his seventh year in the sight of the Lord, while Jehoiada, the priest, instructed him (verses 1-3), but he did not destroy idolatry in the land.

Joashah (or Ahaziah), his youngest son, succeeded him, all his other brothers having been slain by the Syrians. He reigned only one year, and his mother, Athaliah, was his counselor to do wickedly (I Chron. xlii, 1-4). He was slain by Jehu, and when his mother knew that he was dead she at once proceeded to destroy all the seed royal of the house of Judah, but Jehoshaphat, the wife of Jehoshaphat, hid him and his nurse in the house of the Lord six years while Athaliah hid him and his nurse in the house of the Lord six years while Athaliah reigned over the land (II Kings xi, 1-3; II Chron. xxii, 10-12).

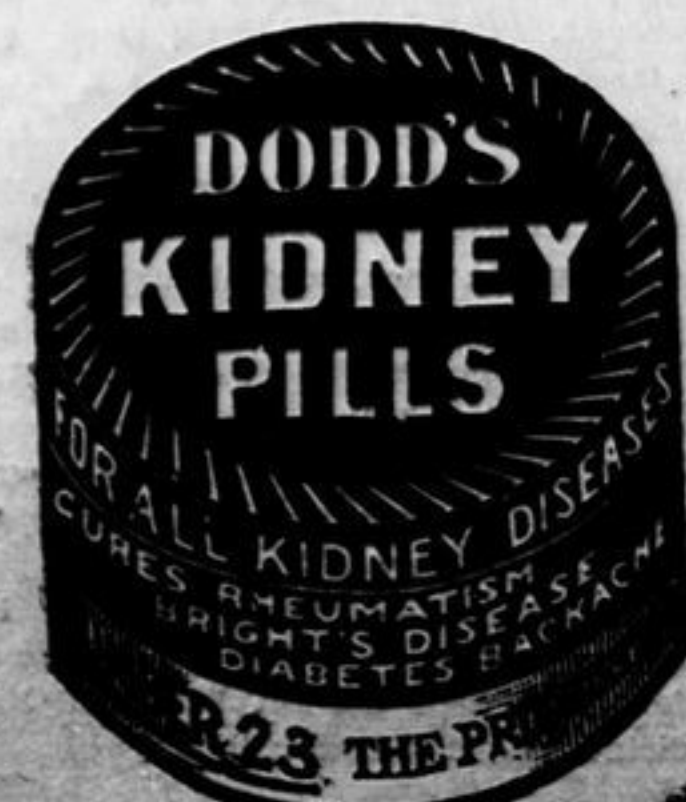
