
The greatest change noticed this morning was in the price of fresh meats, out of the store. In accord ance with the fluctuations in prices in other towns the butchers of Lindsay determined it expedient to do and the price jumped two cents per pound on all cuts. Sirloin steak and porter house raised from 18 to 20 cents; round steak, which was 15c will now sell for 17c; shoulder steak 14c, with a slight advance in rough cuts.


