

London, May 11.—Live cattle firmer, at 111/2c to 12%c per lb., for American steers, dressed weight; Canadian steers, 11c to 12%c per lb.; refrigerator beef, 9c to 91/2c per lb. Sheep, 14c to 15c, dressed weight.

MONTREAL LIVE STOCK. Montreal, May 11.—There were about 450 head of butchers' cattle, 500 calves and 150 sheep and lambs offered for sale at the Hast End Abattoir to-day. The butchers were out strong, but trading was slow, as the prices of good cattle were fully 1/4c per the prices of good cattle were fully 1/4c per 21/c to 31/c per pound. Calves sold from \$1 to \$10 each, or from 21/c to 5c per pound. Sheep sold at from 31/2c to 41/2c per pound. Lambs sold at \$2.50 to \$4.50 each, and an extra lamb brought \$6. Fat hogs sold at from \$6.40 to \$6.65 per hundred pounds, weighed off cars.
