Summer Mining Classes

Preliminary arrangements have been made for the summer mining classes in the northern districts, under the auspices of the Bureau of Mines. These classes in past seasons have been largely attended, and the indications are that the interest this year will be stronger than ever before The instructors for this season are Messrs. E. R. Ardagh of the School of Practical Science and Wyatt Malcolm of Hamilton. The subjects to be dealt with at the classes are :--The elements of mineralogy, mineral spotting, simple geology and practical work. The dates and places tentatively selected for the classes, which are open to all, free of charge are as follows: Bessemer (Farnum iron mine), May 13-18; Latchford, May 21-25 : Cobalt, May 27 to June 1 ; Haileybury, June 3-8 ; New Liskeard, 10-15; Tomstown, 18-22; Larder Lake, 25-29; Giroux Lake, July, 9-13; Cobalt, July 15-20 James township, July 23-27; Lady Evelyn Lake, July 30 to August 3 Sturgeon Falls, August 6-10.

This increase was made up of \$10, 978,787 in imports, and \$1,838,871 in exports. The aggregate of imports for the nine months was \$249,-717,418, and of exports \$192,087,

For March the imports totalled \$36,847,074, and the exports \$15,-

The total trade of last month was over one-third greater than the total trade of March, 1906. For the nine months the duty collected \$40,196,(85, an increase over corresponding period of last year ¥ \$6,998,287.
