RAILWAY BOARD MEET HERE

CROSSING WATCHMEN ON KENT AND LINDSAY STREETS

The Board of Railway Commissioners held a session in Lindsay on Tuesday morning in the Council Chamber. The Board came in on their private car attached to No. 21, and Judge Killam, chairman, and Commissioners Mills and Bernier were the Commissioners.

Two applications were before the Board as follows: (1) Application of the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada under Section 25, sub-section 4, of Railway Act 1908, for an order varying the Order of the Board dated Sept. 4th, 1906, with respect to protection at Kent and Lindsay streets.

The first application was for permission to take off both watchmen at Kent street crossing and the night watchmen as Lindsay street. The G.T.R. claimed that the opening up of their new line to Midland has so lessened traffic on the line over Kent street that they ought to be relieved from the order to maintain watchmen there.

The Commissioners inspected the crossings in the east ward, and in regard to the second application the Commission condemned the system of signals used at Caroline street, such system not being in conformity to the orders of the Board.
