MODEL SCHOOL.

The following letter was received from Dr. Colquhoun, deputy Minister of Education.

Toronto, April 23rd, 1910 I ear Sir,-I am directed by the Minister of Education to inform you that he proposes to retain, for next session beginning September 1st, and ending December 15th) the Model School conducted last year in connection with your Public School. Such Model Schools are intended for the preparation of candidates for the new Limited Third Class Certificates (old District), which will be valid under the regulations where teachers with First or Second Class Certificates are not procurable.

The regulations affecting the Model Schools will be issued shortly. far as your Board of Trustees is concerned the Minister requires :

(1) That your Principal and other Members of the Public School Staff shall be competent for the purposes of Model School : and

(2) That so far as concerns Model School Course the Principal and the Members of the staff engaged in the work shall be subject to the Minister's directions.

It is necessary that the Principals of the Schools shall have had cessful Model School experience. The Minister desires you to submit for his consideration the name and qualifications of the Principal you pro-
