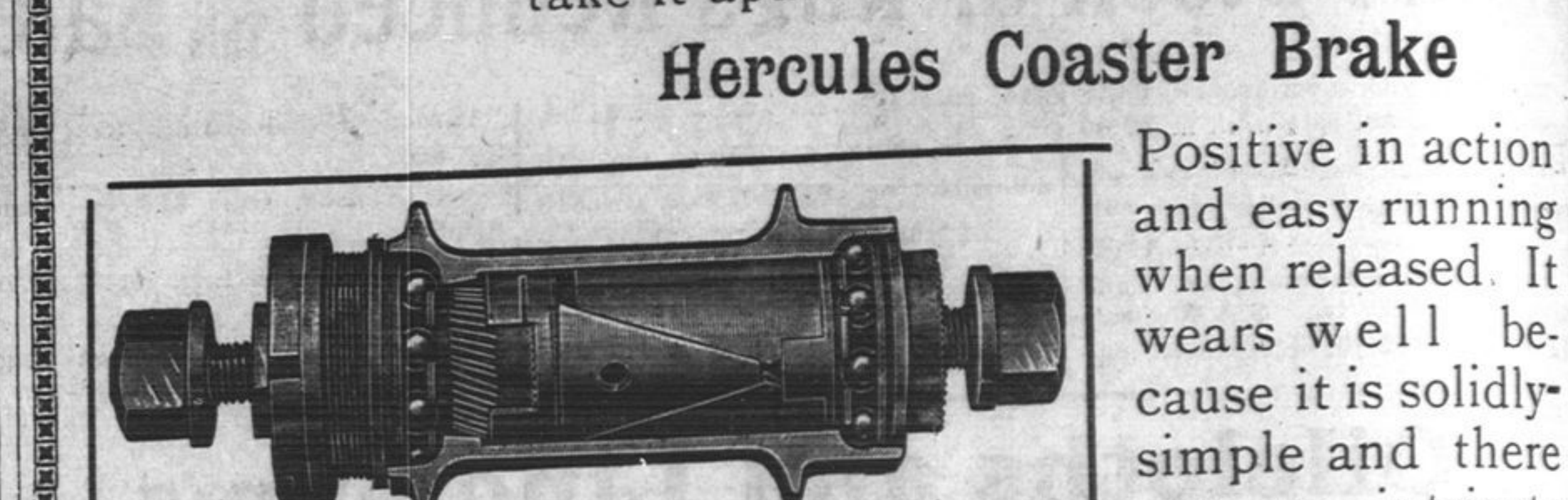

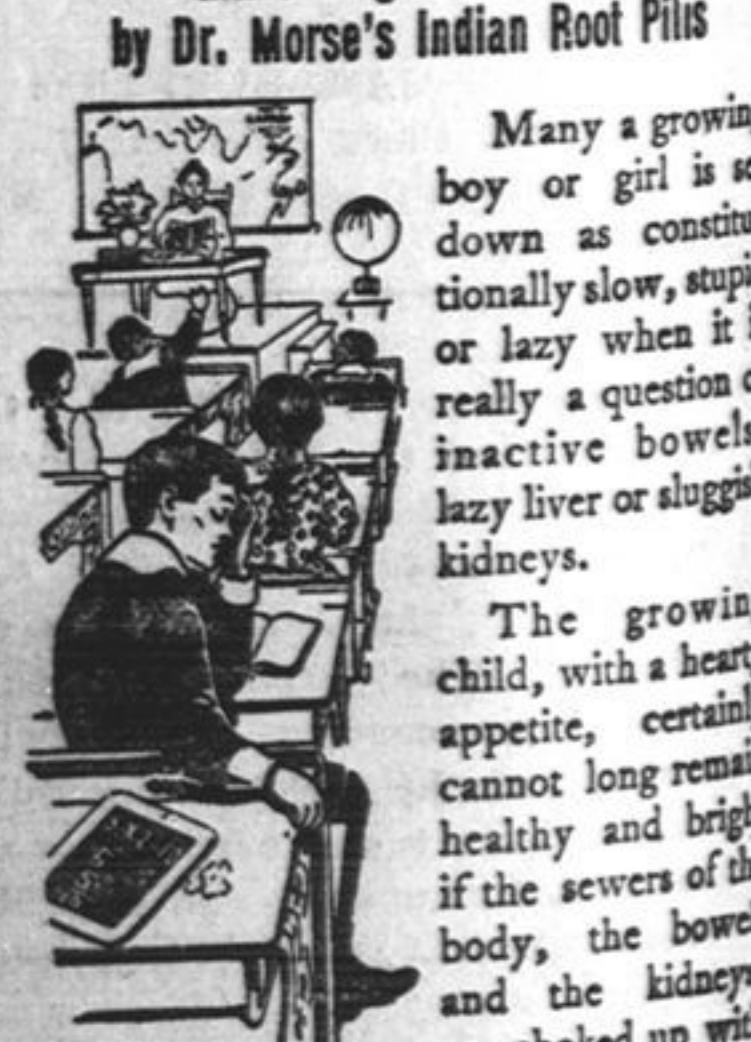
At a meeting of the Board of Education held last evening the following resolution of condolence was passed unanimously by those present, and the same will be forwarded to the Royal family in this their hour of bereavement:

"We, the members of the Lindsay Board of Education desire to place on record our sincere regret occasioned by the death of His Majesty King Edward VII. We deplore the demise of a Sovereign whose reign was devoted to the propagation of peace at home and abroad, and under whose Imperial sway neither was the Constitution overstepped nor even a strain put upon the bulwarks of popular government.

As a citizen of a self-governing member of the Imperial family of the British nation, while sorrowing at the death of our popular and beloved King Edward VII., we also hail with fervent zeal and loyalty the accession of George V. to the throne, so nobly filled by his late lamented father.
