**A SINGLE TAX CITY IN CHINA**

Tsingtau, China, the jewel of the Far East, so writes a resident of that city, is said to be living and thriving under the single tax theory in practise.

Tsingtau is a seaport on the coast of Shantung, in the German territory of Kio-chau, secured by Germany after the China-Japanese war, and where the German Empire made its first experiment and apparently a satisfactory one if we may judge by the spread of the idea in the Fatherland, in the taxation of land values only.

The houses of Tsingtau, says the writer in a recent letter are finer than in any other place in China. The city is equal in comfort, municipal advantages, sanitation, etc., to anything of its size in America. It is the living, breathing example of the possibilities of reforestation and afforestation, for it abounds in growing forests, and its experimental gardens are a delight.

Tsingtau is practically a modern, up-to-date city and shows that even in China a city can be run successfully on the Henry George idea.

Greenwich, Conn., May 18. — Yesterday afternoon, Fred Husted, a prosperous farmer near here, prevailed upon his 12 year old son, Lester, to pull the trigger of his shotgun, which blew the father's head off. Husted had an attack of grip and his act of yesterday has been attributed to that or that he was so impressed by a dream from which he had just awakened that he committed the deed while in a daze. He awoke from a nap about 3 o'clock and told his wife that he felt queer, having just had a bad dream. The husband called the boy, Lester, to the kitchen, and picked up a double barreled shotgun, laid it to pull the trigger as he wanted to hear what it sounded like. The man knelt on the floor, closed one eye and looked into the muzzle of the gun. The boy hesitated and his father said: "It isn't loaded." The boy pulled the trigger, but the piece didn't explode. His father took the gun, cocked it again and laid it back in the same position, while he got on his knees and again looked into the barrel.

"It isn't loaded," he said again. "Pull the trigger and see how it sounds." The boy did so and the father dropped dead. The lad rushed to the nearest neighbor and told him he had killed his father.

**YOUNG MAN WAS KILLED**

The storm in Douro was not an exceedingly severe one, which caused considerable anxiety, but was thought to have no fatal results until the body of young Cummings was found.

At the present time the family is under quarantine with smallpox.

**Fenelon Falls Tries to Block The Deal**

Dr. Sims and Mr. Thos. Junkin of Fenelon Falls were in Ottawa Wednesday and waited on the proper authorities there with a view to having the Dominion Government stop the sale of the Lindsay Light, Heat & Power Company to the Town of Lindsay.

Briefly, it appears that at the present time the Village of Fenelon gets yearly about \$1400 in taxes from the L. H. & P. Co., but that if the Town of Lindsay purchase the plant the village will not be entitled to the taxes. That is, according to law no municipality need pay taxes to another municipality. Fearing that Fenelon Falls would lose these taxes the corporation council will endeavor to block the deal through the Government.

At a recent meeting of the Lindsay town council this situation was explained by the town solicitor and the feeling of the Lindsay councillors was that the Village of Fenelon Falls should be treated fairly in this matter. Although the town is not liable it would be only right to deal fairly with the people of Fenelon Falls and the question was dropped with the understanding that some arrangement satisfactory to the people of Fenelon Falls should be settled upon.
