NATIONAL DAIRY SHOW.

A meeting of representatives from the organizations interested was held in Toronto on Tuesday last, when it was decided to hold a National Dairy Show in the St. Lawrence Arena, Toronto, during the last week of January, 1908. About \$8,000 is being raised to conduct the show, over one-half of which has been promised.

The arbitrators in the milk dispute between the Toronto Milk Producers and Retailers' Associations have given their award, and the price of milk on the producer for the next six months will be \$1.23 per eight gallons can, delivered in Toronto, or \$1.08 at the farmer's gate. This is about as much as the producers asked for and the award will be unsatisfactory to all concerned.

CHEESE BOARD

1255 BOXES SOLD AT 11 1/2 CENTS PER POUND AT FIRST SALE ON MONDAY.

The annual meeting of the Victoria County Cheese Board was held in the Lindsay Council Chamber on Monday morning at 10 o'clock. The Board, president, occupied the chair, and there were present, in addition to representatives and salesmen of the different factories, Messrs. Alex. Kennedy, the vice-president, Geo. Rea, the treasurer, and Eugene Skayne, the secretary.

In opening, President Robertson referred to the scarcity of cheese earlier in the season, and this causing the holding of the first sale on this date, instead of June 3rd, as formerly intended.

On motion of Mr. Taylor Parkin, the Board was unanimously selected, and Mr. G. Rea, was elected. The statement of the treasurer, and showed that after all accounts and debts were paid the Board had a balance of \$23.20 to the good.

In this regard Secretary Skayne said that it had been suggested to the Board that the Board give a grant of \$15 towards five prizes of \$3 each to the Agricultural Society to set aside a similar amount for the same good purpose. It was decided that the grant be made on the conditions, that the Agricultural Society set aside the same amount, and that the cheese-maker who sold the most cheese receive the money for prize-winning cheese. Five prizes will be offered and all factories may compete.

Some discussion was brought on over the matter of shipping green cheese. Buyer G. Leslie, wished to have the salesmen of the Board set up a box for this and it seemed to be the general opinion of the Board that no shipments should be made of cheese till it was in proper condition.

"We don't want to ship green cheese, and don't want to counterbalance such a thing," said Robertson. "I'm not in favor of any means of such shipments, for they work to the detriment of the reputation of the factories and boards."

When the cheese was boarded Mr. Flavelle opened the bidding at 11 1/2 cents a pound. Mr. Flavelle run it raised at 11 1/2. Mr. Gillespie made it 11 1/2 cents for selections. He called Star, Dunford, Mariposa, North Ops and Maple Leaf, all accepting. Mr. Flavelle secured the second choice at 11 1/2 cents. He called North Verulam, Bobcaygeon, North Ops and Maple Leaf, all accepting. Mr. Flavelle, Felsington and Reaboro. The balance—Cameron, Omeme and Cambray—were secured by Buyer Brown, and accepted, at the 11 1/2 cents bid.

The following are the factories represented with the number of cheese boarded by each:

Bobcaygeon 163, Omemee 155, North Verulam 146, Mariposa 90, Red Rock 81, Star 80, Reaboro 80, North Harvey 78, Cambray 72, Maple Leaf 70, Dunford 68, Cameron 60, Palestine 57, North Ops 52.
