NOT SATISFACTORY. A Discussion on Curd Knives

By D. J. Cameron, Victoria county.—If the factory is to keep but one set of curd knives, I would recommend the 1/2 horizontal blade knife and the 5-16 perpendicular wire knife. The 5-16 inch knife is hardy fine enough for fast working milk, and if such milk is received in quantity a 1/2-inch perpendicular knife should be on hand as well. A good general rule is to use the knife that will give the cleanest cut with the least breakage to the curd. The best plan is to educate the patron to bring in the kind of milk that may be handled with a 5-16 knife.

A blade knife has advantages over the wire knife; at least it used to have. It is more durable and with the kind of knives we got at one time, when they got dull they could be sharpened. This is no longer possible, however, with the poor quality of steel put into the knives now on the market.
