**MR. SPENCE'S INJURIES.**

Peterboro Examiner: Mr. John Spence, conductor on the C. G. E. line car of the Radial Railway, returned to work to-day for the first time since the G.T.R. wreck, a week ago Saturday night, above Lindsay. Mr. Spence was in the car in which Mrs. Babcock was killed and received a severe shaking up, in addition to injuries from which he is still lame. He will not soon forget his experience in the wreck and his narrow escape from what might have been a personal fatality.

Arthur Filder, withdrawn; R. H. Pearce, over-charged on acres of land, rectified; W. J. Mitchell, assessed at \$700, reduced to \$500; Sir William McKenzie, assessed \$20,000, reduced to \$15,000; Kirkfield Protestant Cemetery, assessed \$39,150, reduced to \$34,400. Business assessment of \$100 was ordered to be put on Peter Sinclair, which was omitted. The Court adjourned to May 31. All the members went in the forenoon to inspect W. J. Mitchell's and Sir William McKenzie's properties.

Mr. W. J. Mitchell has since appealed to the Judge against the decision of the Court of Revision on his and Sir William McKenzie's appeal.

Council proceedings were as follows: Moved by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Benson, that the following amounts be paid: Pat. Fitzgerald, for repairing wharftop on Victoria Road, \$12; Wm. McCarney for 21 loads of gravel \$2.10; Fred Waddis repairing road, \$2; J. J. Montgomery, bonus on 40 rods of wire fence, \$6; J. S. Black, wages \$2; James Bell, repairing road \$9; A. Taylor, clerk, part of salary, \$35; J. A. Cussed by trustees of both sections.

Moved by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Benson, that the N. pts. of lots 1 and 2 be detached from No. 6 and attached to No. 9.—Carried.

Tenders for the purchase of the Richman, repairing road \$1.50; expenses to Lindsay, \$3.50; H. Davey repairing sidewalk \$2.—Carried.

On motion of Mr. Lytle, seconded by Mr. Carl, the following grants were made for the roads: \$60 for Junction road, \$25 Base line, James Bell, Com.; \$100 on con. 2. \$25 on boundary, Laxton to give same; \$25 on Beat 14, G. J. Peel, com.; \$200 for Coboconk; \$50 for Victoria Road; \$50 on Cameron road, Chris. Moore, Com.—Carried.

The clerk was instructed to order five cement culverts.

Application of trustees of S. S. No. 9 to get Fred Waddis' property from school section No. 6 was dis- \$4,000 Bexley debentures were opened from four Toronto brokers. The best offer was \$3,981 with accrued interest. Tenders not accepted.

By-law No. 425 to charge cirruses and other shows license fees was read three times and passed.

Moved by Mr. Lytle, seconded by Mr. Carl, that Jos. H. Black, m. Smith and David Wright be commissioners to expend Government and by-law money \$500 on Base line, \$200 on Doyle road, and \$200 on Lake Shore road.—Carried.

The meeting then adjourned to meet on the 15th of August at Coboconk.
