Ramatlabama Camp, Bechuanaland S. Africa, May 28th, 1900.

My Dear Sister:—Yesterday was the first word I have received from home since I started from Halifax and although it was written a long time ago, still I was very glad to get word from home.

Well as you know, a very important event has taken place since then, but probably you do not know that I was one of the 64 Canadians who took part in the action which resulted in the relief of Mafeking.

On Wednesday morning at 6 a.m. we left our temporary camp for Mafeking. Our line of march was thoroughly scouted so that we did not make very quick time.

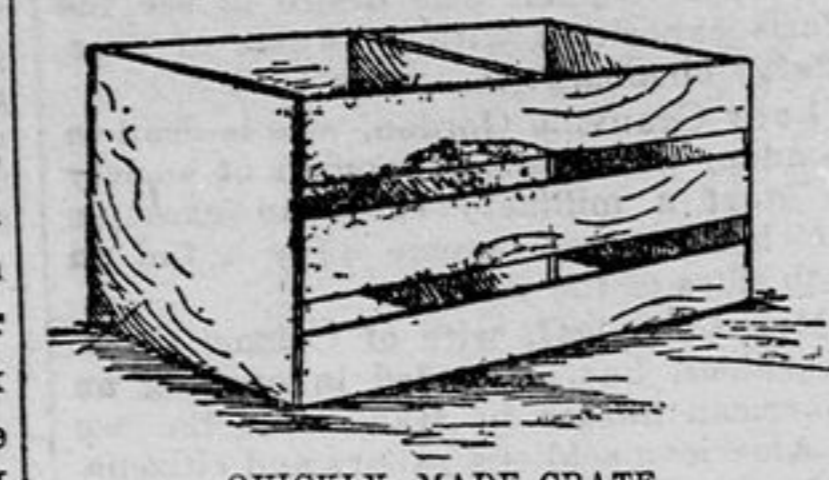
About mid-night we advanced in the direction of Mafeking and arrived there about 5 o'clock on the morning of the 17th.

During our short stay in Mafeking we had ample opportunity to see the terrible results of the long siege. The people all lived in underground trenches and there was scarcely a building but had been more or less injured by shells.

On Saturday morning under Col. Plummer we left Mafeking and marched out here about 16 miles where we have remained ever since. I cannot say how

long we will be here or what will be our next move. We are simply protecting the re-construction of a railway which was destroyed by the Boers.

—A dense fog hung over the Irish Channel Saturday, and the Cunard line steamship Campania, en route for Liverpool from New York, struck the Liverpool barque Embleton, bound for New Zealand.

—Ever since the Welland canal outrage the Dominion police have been keeping a quiet watch on all the canals. Saturday the force on the Cornwall canal was suddenly increased to thirty men.

—Another Indian murder was committed at Kamloops, B.C., on Saturday. Shortly after three o'clock two Indian women were seen riding up Fourth avenue at a full gallop.

The victim of his deadly work was his young wife. Whisky and jealousy was the cause of the awful crime. The prisoner was immediately lodged in gaol. The tragedy took place within three blocks of the spot where poor Phil Walker was murdered by the Indian Cashmer, a little over a year ago.
