

BY-LAW NO. 974

A BY-LAW TO RAISE BY LOAN \$20,000.00 TO PURCHASE ROAD MACHINERY AND MAKE PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS ON THE LEADING STREETS.

WHEREAS it is necessary and desirable to raise by loan \$20,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing road-making machinery, and making permanent improvements on the leading streets in the town of Lindsay...

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to create a debt to the extent of Twenty Thousand Dollars, and to issue Debentures therefor in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

AND WHEREAS \$1,471.64 is the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate for the period of twenty years for paying the said debt and interest thereon at four per cent per annum, in instalments according to the terms of this By-law, so that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years for such period.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Lindsay, according to the last Revised Assessment Roll, is the sum of \$1,934,981.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing Debenture Debt of the Town of Lindsay, exclusive of Local Improvement Debts, secured by special acts, rates or assessments, is \$233,953.24, and there is no part of the principal or interest of the said existing debt in arrear.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LINDSAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That for the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Mayor of the said Corporation, and he is hereby authorized and required, to cause debentures of the said Town of Lindsay to be made, executed and issued to the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars, payable in annual instalments on the First day of October, in each year, for twenty years, for the following amounts for principal and interest for the following years respectively, that is to say:

2. That the said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable on the First day of October in each year, and shall have coupons attached to the payment of interest, and the Debentures and Coupons shall be made payable at the office of the Town Treasurer.

3. That there shall be raised and levied in each year for the payment of the said debt and interest, and the debentures issued therefor, the sum of \$1,471.64 during the currency of the said debt and debentures by a special rate sufficient therefor on all rateable property in the Municipality of the Town of Lindsay, the same being sufficient to discharge the several yearly sums of principal and interest accruing due as the said sums become respectively payable according to the terms of this By-law.

4. That the said Debentures shall be issued all at one time and may be issued at any time after the First day of October, 1902, and within two years after the passing of this By-law.

5. That the proceeds of the said Debentures shall be deposited to a special account in the Bank to the credit of the Town, and shall not be paid out except upon the cheque of the Town Treasurer countersigned by the Commissioners hereinafter mentioned, or a majority of them.

6. That the Mayor and the Chairman of the Board of Works for the time being, and Messrs. George McHugh, John D. Flavell and James Graham, be and are hereby appointed Commissioners, without salary or pay, to expend the said moneys, and in the event of the said George McHugh, John D. Flavell or James Graham, or any person hereafter appointed in their place, dying, or becoming incapable or refusing to act, some other fit and proper person shall be appointed by the Council in the place of the person dying or becoming incapable or refusing to act, so that there shall be three Commissioners capable and willing to act, in addition to the Mayor and the Chairman of the Board of Works.

7. That the proceeds of the said debentures shall be expended by the said Commissioners for the purpose of purchasing road machinery and in making permanent improvements on the leading streets of the Town, and for no other purpose whatsoever, the same to be expended as far as practicable and advisable upon the plan of street improvement recommended by Road Commissioner Campbell.

8. That the said Commissioners shall be at liberty to call upon any of the Town officials to assist them in the expenditure of the said moneys, and the town officials when so requested shall assist the Commissioners in the expenditure of the same in the same manner as if the moneys were being expended by the Council, and the officials so assisting shall not be entitled to or allowed

any additional remuneration that he would not be entitled to if the same were being expended by the Council.

9. That the vote of all electors in the Town of Lindsay entitled to vote thereon shall be taken on this By-law on...

BY-LAW NO. 976

A BY-LAW TO RAISE THE SUM OF \$14,000.00 FOR THE ERECTION OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE NORTH WARD, AND TO ISSUE DEBENTURES THEREFOR.

WHEREAS the Board of Education for the Town of Lindsay have requested the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Lindsay to raise the sum of \$14,000.00 for the erection of a Public School house in the North Ward, and to issue debentures therefor.

AND WHEREAS the Council have refused to raise or borrow the said sum for the purposes aforesaid without the assent of the Electors, and the said Board of Education have requested that the question shall be submitted to a vote of the Electors, as provided for by Section 76 of the Public Schools Act, and the Council have decided to do so:

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to create a debt to the extent of Fourteen Thousand Dollars and to issue debentures therefor in manner hereinafter mentioned:

AND WHEREAS \$809.63 is the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate for the period of thirty years for paying the said debt and interest thereon at four per cent per annum, in instalments according to the terms of this By-law, so that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years for such period;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Lindsay, according to the last Revised Assessment Roll, is the sum of \$1,934,981.00.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the Town of Lindsay, exclusive of Local Improvement Debts secured by special acts, rates or assessments, is \$233,953.24, and there is no part of the principal or interest of the said existing debt in arrear.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LINDSAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That for the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Mayor of the said Corporation, and he is hereby authorized and required, to cause debentures of the said Town of Lindsay to be made, executed and issued to the amount of Fourteen Thousand Dollars, in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars, payable in annual instalments on the First day of October, in each year, for thirty years, for the following amounts for principal and interest for the following years respectively, that is to say:

BY-LAW NO. 977

A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF DEBENTURES FOR THE PURPOSE OF A PUBLIC LIBRARY.

WHEREAS a By-law of the Municipal Council of the Town of Lindsay was passed on the Ninth day of January, A.D. 1899, establishing a Public Library in this Municipality under the Public Libraries Act;

AND WHEREAS a sum of Two Thousand Dollars is required for the purpose of purchasing a site for the erection of a building for the said Public Library, as appears by the special estimate for that purpose furnished by the Lindsay Public Library Board to the Council;

AND WHEREAS for the purpose aforesaid it is necessary to create a debt to the extent of Two Thousand Dollars and to issue debentures therefor in manner hereinafter mentioned;

AND WHEREAS it will require the sum of \$147.17 annually for the period of twenty years for the payment of the debt created by this By-law, with interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, in instalments according to the terms of this By-law, so that the aggregate amount payable for the principal and interest in each year shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years for such period, and it is desirable to have the debentures to be issued therefor payable in twenty annual instalments or block sums of \$147.17 and so drawn as to include the principal and interest at four per cent per annum as hereinafter set out, instead of debentures with coupons.

That there shall be raised and levied in each year for the payment of the said debt and interest, and the debentures issued therefor, the sum of \$147.17 during the currency of the said debt and debentures by a special rate sufficient therefor on all rateable property in the Municipality of the Town of Lindsay, the same being sufficient to discharge the several yearly sums of principal and interest accruing due as the said sums become respectively payable according to the terms of this By-law.

3. That the said Debentures shall be issued all at one time and may be issued at any time after the First day of October, 1902, and within two years after the passing of this By-law.

4. That the proceeds of the said Debentures shall be paid to the Town Treasurer, and paid and applied for the purposes and with the objects above recited, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

5. That the votes of all the Electors in the Town of Lindsay qualified to vote under the Municipal Act for the creation of debts shall be taken on this By-law on...

MONDAY, THE 18th DAY OF AUGUST, 1902,

from 9 o'clock in the forenoon until 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the following places, and the following shall be the Deputy Returning Officers to take the votes at the respective places:
