AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT (By Student of Agriculture)

CLEAN MILK The following resolutions were made early in the year by Local Boards of Health governing milk supplies offered for sale for domestic use, as approved by the Provincial Board of Health of Ontario: STANDARD OF MILK. 1. All milk containing less than thirteen per cent. of total solids, of which three and three-quarters per cent. must be chemically dry butter-fat, should be deemed unfit for use, and should be returned to the standard required when the same is intended for human consumption. BUILDINGS. 2. All buildings for stabling cows should be so located that they will have good drainage; the floors should be water tight and of some non-absorbing material, and properly graded and drained. 3. No building used for dairy purposes should be within 100 feet of the building used for keeping or handling milk. 4. The surroundings of all buildings must be kept clean and in good order. Manure, dirt or decaying matter must not be allowed to accumulate in the barnyard and should not be at any time in contact with the stable or milk house, or at least within fifty feet of the same. Removal thereof at frequent intervals is required. 5. The stable-yard should be well drained so as to be usually dry and no pools allowed to form. 6. The stables where cows are kept should be used for no other purpose. They should not be used as storage places for straw, hay or other feeds, or as a wagon or cart house. 7. The buildings should be well lighted and so ventilated (preferably from the top) that no disagreeable or strong odor shall be noticeable. 8. The stable in which cows are kept continuously (as in stony weather) should be cleaned often enough to be kept reasonably free from the odor of manure. 9. Each cow should be allowed at least 500 cubic feet of air space. 10. The cows' stalls should be at least three feet wide and the flooring should be rough enough so that all manure will be dropped into the gutter and not upon the floor. 11. The gutters behind the cows should be open and of a depth of 6 or 8 inches, with sufficient incline to insure good drainage. They should be kept free from manure. 12. The walls and ceilings should be kept clean and whitewashed at least twice a year. 13. The stables should be thoroughly cleaned at least an hour before milking, and all manure removed therefrom, or not until after milking. Dry fodder should be fed to cows either during or just before milking. THE COWS. 14. The herd from which the milk is sold shall not include any sick cows, and especially none showing signs of tuberculosis, contagious abortion or any other trouble, or mammary abscess, or other abnormality with participation, or with erud disease, or one that is within thirty days of calving. 15. Any cow showing evidence of ill-health or being off feed should be stable and the milk of such cow should not be sold. 16. The employment of the tuberculin test is recommended for the detection of tuberculosis. 17. The cows should at all times be kept in a healthy condition.

MADE FIRE ESTIMATES. Mr. W. J. Phillips, inspector for the London Fire Insurance Co., was in town Tuesday and estimated the loss at the fire in the Grand Union hotel stables Sunday morning. His estimate was not made public.

DECREASE IN DUTIES. There is a marked decrease in the customs for the month of June this year as compared with the receipts for the same month in 1907. The total receipts for June 1907 amounted to \$205,923.93, for June of the present year \$115,156.36, showing a decrease of nearly 50 per cent. The remarkable falling off is attributed to the present financial depression.

FEEDS, STUFFS, WATER, ETC. 20. No mouldy hay, decomposed vegetables, wet brewer's grains, or any other materials, that are unsound or will affect the taste or character of the milk, shall be fed the cows. 21. Every dairy should be supplied with pure water, the source of which shall not be contaminated by any barn-yard, privy or other possible source of contamination.

EMPLOYEES' HABITS, ETC. 23. Employees should be clean in their habits and free from contagious diseases. 24. No person connected with the dairy shall enter a house where smallpox, typhoid fever, diphtheria, scarlet fever, measles or other contagion exists, or is known to have existed, until it has been disinfected.
