## The Gasoline Launch Spoils Fishing

In a letter published in a Toronto daily, Mr. A. C. Yokome, of Peterboro, says:

The fishing on the Otonabee River at Peterboro this year is so poor that the seasoned and the most patient of anglers have become thoroughly disheartened. It is no joke to rise about 3.30 on a haze-veiled morning and placidly sit for three or four hours without feeling even the slightest tremor on your fishing line to indicate that a hungry and inquisitive fish is nosing around the bait. But this is what the fishers on the Otonabee have had to do all summer, and many of them have become discouraged that they have stored their fish-snaring equipment away up in the garret with grandfather's clock that has refused to tick for the past quarter of a century.

The eternal gasoline launch is responsible for it all. The continual churning of the waters and the residue of the gasoline oil on the surface have spoiled fishing in the vicinity of Peterboro. And the Otonabee used to be one of the most prolific bass and lunge grounds in the Province.

Now the fish are all in Rice Lake, twenty-five miles south of Peterboro by the river route. The story of the fishermen's distress in this district applies with equal force to all rivers and more confined bodies of water where the gasoline launches ply their busy way. The gasoline launch to the fish is much as the scarecrow is to the crow—only the launch is more effective.
