Canada's Revenue. The revenue of the Dominion for the nine months ended Dec. 31 of the current fiscal year, shows an increase of \$25,094,669, having totalled \$124,577,566, as against \$99,482,947 for the corresponding period of 1917-18. The ordinary expenditures for the nine months totalled \$67,004,875, as against \$54,933,871, an increase of \$12,071,004. There was an increase in capital expenditure of \$3,688,749, namely, from \$19,983,354 to \$23,672,103.
