and the water in a clean saucpan and stir the water over the fire until the soap is melted. Beat the yolk of the egg and the lemon juice together, pour the soap and water on it, stirring it briskly, and when it is cold bottle it for use.

Girls with a luxuriant crop of hair will find that they will require if they use eggs only as a shampoo seven or eight, and plenty of rain or softened water.
