HEALEY FALLS POWER

J. T. Culverwell and Frank M. Field, of Cobourg, were in Toronto recently in connection with the lease of the Healey Falls water power acquired from the government about two months ago. They expect to proceed under the charter of the Northumberland-Durham Power Company, with the development of 4400 horsepower there at an early date. The lease was granted at the request of twelve municipalities in the counties concerned and is safeguarded according to recommendations made by the hydro-electric commission. It is not the policy of the commission to build power plants, but such a semipublic corporation as the Northumberland-Durham Company will enable the people of the district to be supplied with power at the most advandeveloped.
