WEESE GRAVEL RECOMMENDED

Mr. W. A. Weese, in a conversation with a Warder man last week stated that he can bring forth evidence of the most reliable character which would bear out the opinion expressed by Reeve Babcock at the last special meeting of the town council, that the gravel purchased for street improvements from his pit was of a high standard.

Mr. Weese stated that the Ops road commissioners have purchased several loads for road improvement from his pit and are perfectly satisfied with the material. In some instances, he stated, they had drawn it a distance of four miles. It would appear from his conversation that he is not overly anxious to force the output of his pit upon the citizens, but that he desires to make it clear that he has got first-class road building material.

Should any taxpayer hold sceptical views on the reliability of the foregoing statements, an interview with one or all of the following gentlemen will show conclusively to what extent they value the material in Mr. Weese's pit: Mr. Wes. Waldon, road commissioner of Ops, who has used it for three years; Mr. P. Leedy, pathmaster, Ops, using it on beat for a number of years; Albert Hardy, pathmaster, used on his beat also; William Channon, Mariposa has drawn this gravel five miles owing to its superior quality, and Frank Armstrong, liverman, also, who claims to be an expert in determining quality in gravel, having served 14 years with the G. T. R., harrassing the road bed, claims it is as good material as he ever saw used in his many years experience as a roadmaker.

Mr. Weese claims the material can be used for mixing concrete with as good results as could be desired.

CROPS FINE IN EMILY.

"The crops on the whole are excellent, and the farmers have no kick coming," was the statement made to a Warder man yesterday by Mr. Wm. LeHane.

Mr. LeHane the day previous visited several farms in Verulam and Emily, and all along the way, he stated, the crops were looking fine. "I never saw such a crop of hay. It is tall and thick, and the very best. There should be no shortage of hay this winter and the prices should not be so long. I also saw a field of peas cut, and I have never in my life set eyes on a better crop of peas. Oats, barley and wheat are also looking well, and I think the farmers are going to have a bountiful harvest. Of course there is an odd field of trumpy stuff, poor miserable growth, but on the whole the crops in that section of the country are A.1."

BULL WRECKED TRAIN.
London, Ont., July 24.—A bull which got out of a field and tried to amuse himself by racing down the Grand Trunk tracks and charging east bound way freight No. 732, enroute from the tunnel to Toronto, wrecked the train last evening at Ingersoll. Engineer Bailey was unable to stop and the engine and eight freight cars were thrown off the track and badly smashed up as a result of the bull getting under the wheels. No one was injured. One of the derailed cars contained automobiles but they were not seriously damaged.

Rowell and Clubs

A writer in the Toronto News calls attention to the position of Mr. Rowell on the question of the abolition of the bar, and points out how little the Liberal leader knows of the question upon which he is agitating the country. His half-way proposition is sheer humbug. The writer in the News says: "The leader of the Opposition has returned to the 'Club' question. He thence that the clubs that were in existence when the present Government came in simply sold liquor without a license. When this was pointed out to the present Government an amendment to the Act was made and a license was charged. In 1907 the number of clubs that paid the fee was 24, and in the next year the number that paid was 8, but there was no increase in the number of chartered clubs. Since that time the number has been increased to 54, but more than half of that increase, I venture to say, was made up of clubs already chartered but which had not paid a fee in the previous years. Even now I know of more clubs than one which have been existing twenty years and have supplied liquor to their members and have not paid a fee. If they are added to the list it will make the number larger on paper, but not in reality.
