A Post Office Complete At Every Farmer's Gate

By a decision arrived at a short time ago in Ottawa, the rural mail delivery service of Canada, is to be improved within the next few months to the extent of providing at every farmer's gate all the facilities necessary for transacting general office business.

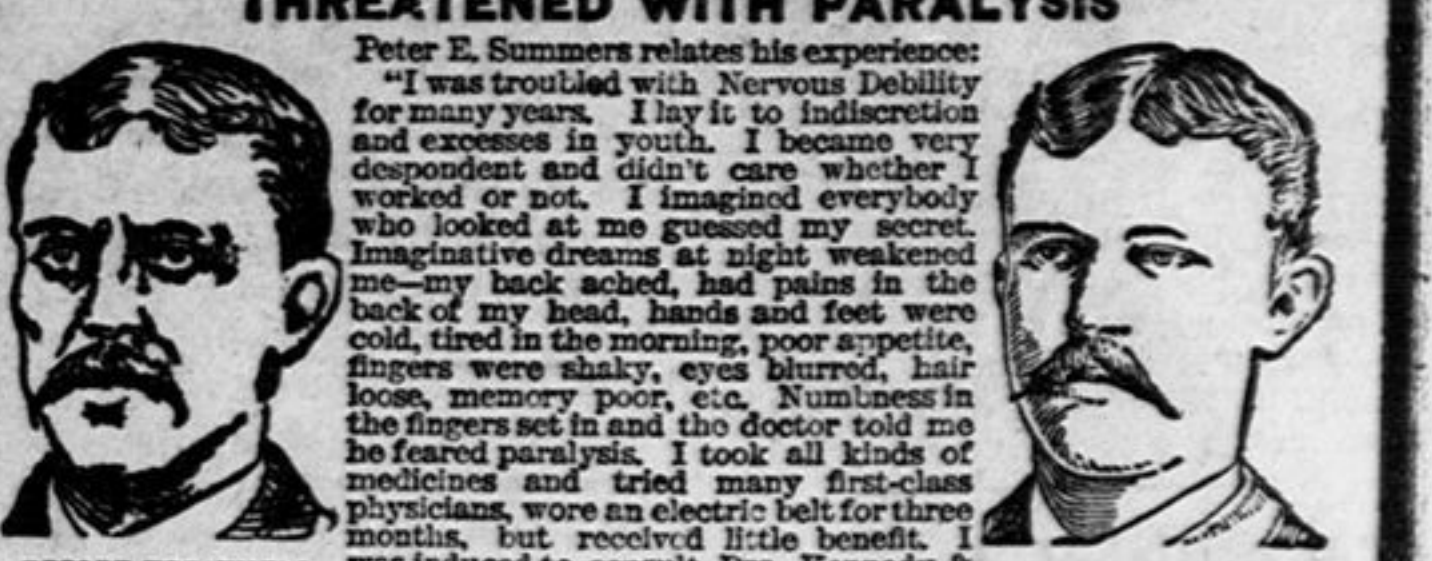
The advantages of the rural delivery service are now open to all farmers who show by application or general petition that they are desirous of it. Formerly only those farmers whose homes lay along the regular country mail route could obtain the privileges of delivery at their gates.

The popular opinion among farmers not served by mail delivery that the Government will take the initiative is very erroneous. The Post Office Department has never yet sent a proposal by letter or representative to any community of farmers suggesting the establishment of a delivery service but rather every highway sharing in the privilege owes gratitude only to its own enterprise.

Parliament last season appropriated \$200,000 to be expended upon the extension of rural mail delivery routes, which, according to the statement of Mr. A. Boldue, Superintendent of the Rural Delivery Branch, is a sufficient sum to provide for the establishment of 400 additional routes.
