Toll of Railways In United States

Washington, Aug. 17.--Railroad accidents and the casualties resulting were on the increase during the three months which ended March 31. The quarterly accident bulletin issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission to-day shows 2,383 persons were killed and 20,499 were injured. In train accidents, 267 persons were killed and 4,785 were injured, an increase of 121 killed and 1,555 injured as compared with the corresponding quarter of 1911.
