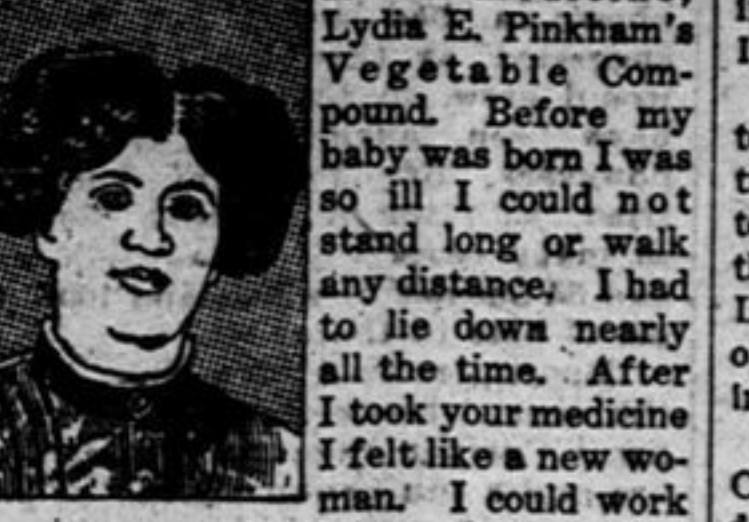

Rich Finds of Apatite. Ottawa, Aug. 24.—Discoveries of apatite around Ottawa, Hull and the Ottawa Valley are being investigated by Prof. Wilhelm Palmær of the Royal Institute of Technology, Stockholm, Sweden, and these may lead to the establishment of a new industry here. Hitherto apatite has been regarded as of no value, but Prof. Palmær has developed a new process by which it may be turned into a useful fertilizer.

Salvationists At London Pay Tribute. London, Aug. 23.—Great crowds gathered under Congress Hall all day, hoping to view the body of the late Salvationist leader, Gen. William Booth, which for the past two days has been lying in state. The body, however, had been removed over night to the general's private room and the hall was used for the regular Salvationist services.
