THEY WERE ONLY A FEW FEET FROM HIM AT THE TIME.

A wave of pained surprize, sorrow and indignation swept over the civilized world on Friday afternoon with omissions in the Voters' List of the news that President McKinley had been shot on the exhibition grounds at Buffalo.

The president was holding a public reception in the Temple of Music at about 4 o'clock. Among those who came to greet him was a man wearing a handkerchief tied around one hand. 
