Florence, Italy, Sept. 1-The employees of 40 different callings have MGHEST PRICES paid for Butter joined the strike which began last and Eggs, either for cash or in Friday. The town appears to be in a state of seige. Six thousand troops have been recailed from the ranoeuvres, and every square in the city is occupied by a company of soldiers. Strong infantry and cavalry patrols are parading the streets and subarbs. All meetings and processions have been forbidden, and hundreds of suspected persons have been arrested.

The strikers include the gas and tramway employees, and they have committed several acts of vandalism, cutting gas pipes and attempting inpounds at a time. 


