Buyers Flavelle and Fitzgerald were the only buyers at the Cheese Board on Monday.

Before bidding began Buyer Flavelle read a letter he had received from Buyer Wrighton at Peterboro denying the statement made here at the last meeting to the effect that cheese sold at Peterboro had been refused because the buyers had paid too much for it.

The factories will pay half of the inspector's fees at next meeting.

Mr. Flavelle offered 9 1/2 cents, which Fitzgerald made 9 1/2 in a round of bidding.

The president said that factories assigning their cheese were making more money than those selling on the board.

Buyer Fitzgerald offered the same and took Maple Leaf 118, Reboro 138, Pine Grove 56, North Ops 57, Omenee 153, Dunsford 141, Star 120 and Janetville 50.
