

MEETING OF COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES

MUCH WORK TRANSACTED. BY-LAW AMENDED RE CIGARETTES, PAPER AND TOBACCO. DISCUSSION OF FINANCIAL MATTERS.

COLLECTOR APPOINTED.

The by-law to appoint a collector of taxes was given its regular reading and finally passed.

CIGARETTE BY-LAW.

On the initiative of Ald. Eyles, the clause in the tobacco license by-law was amended so as to require a \$50 license for the sale of either cigarettes, cigarette tobacco or cigarette paper, or all three.

DEATH OF THOMAS HICKEY, OPS

Mr. Thomas Hickey, the well-known and popular agent for the Deering Harvester Co., died at his home in Ops on Sunday morning, after an illness of only about six months.

The deceased was a son of the late Patrick Hickey, one of the pioneers of this district. At the time of his death he was 57 years of age.

The late Thomas Hickey was a highly successful farmer, a popular and valued agent of the Deering farm, and an esteemed and respected resident of the township.

The funeral took place on Tuesday at St. Mary's church and thence to the R. C. cemetery. The large cortege of mourning friends—one of the largest seen here for some time—was only one slight evidence of the esteem in which the deceased was held by all and the deep and sincere sorrow felt at his demise.

THE LATE DENNIS SCULLY, EMILY.

Mr. Dennis Scully, one of the most respected and best known of the farmers of Emily township, died at his home on Saturday evening.

The deceased was esteemed alike for many excellent qualities of mind and heart and his death will be much regretted. For over a quarter of a century the late Dennis Scully was actively concerned in the municipal affairs of the township and he has represented that municipality ably and conscientiously as a councillor, a reeve and as a member of the County Council.

The deceased leaves five sons and five daughters, and to these and to the other near relatives and close friends will be extended all sympathy.

The funeral took place on Tuesday morning, and was very largely attended.
