PURITY AND CLEANLINESS

All meat, fish, vegetable and fruit canneries doing an export or interprovincial business come under the provisions of the Act, and as there are few, if any canneries, that do not sell stuff outside one province, practically the whole trade is included. In the large packing houses one or more inspectors will be on duty every working hour ; and the smaller establishments will be visited at unexpected times by officials clothed with authority to practically close men and methods, raw material and product-is in a perfectly clean and wholesome condition, the manufacturers will have the right to use stamp consisting of a crown and the words "Canada approved," which will serve as a guarantee to the world.
