

Fall Millinery Openings Large, Modish Display

The Various Millinery Parlors in Lindsay Ravalling Each Other in the Charm and Exclusiveness of the Fashionable Designs Shown. A Very Creditable Display for the Fall Opening. Some of the Choice Hats Shown. Successful Openings.

There seems to be a pleasant rivalry existing between the millinery parlors in Lindsay, and each appears to vie with the other as to the taste, originality and fashionable charm of the creations displayed. The openings of the various parlors were very successful this season, and largely attended. The visiting ladies found at each millinery shop handsome displays of the latest styles and shades and the original and charming designs were the delight of all. Some of the stocks shown were larger than others, but it would be very difficult to award places to the respective parlors, for outside the sizes of the displays, the fashionable shapes and shades in hats were followed almost invariably with much success and with originality and charm. The headwear fashionable for this season seems to take specially harmonious and beautiful lines, and the shades and trimmings used easily adapt themselves in the skillful and artistic hands of the local milliners to beautiful and charming effects. To be appreciated the displays must be seen and the following paragraphs are simply given as a suggestion and with the desire to tempt ladies who have not yet attended the parlors since the arrival of fall styles to visit and feast their eyes on the elegant and fashionable showing in all kinds of hats. The milliners of Lindsay are deserving of much commendation for the displays offered—they would do credit to most cities—and the ladies of Lindsay and district are to be congratulated on being able to see and secure right in their own home town such a choice of the most fashionable in handsome and dainty effects in millinery.

At Dundas & Flavelles

The large and well appointed store of Dundas & Flavelles is too well known for its elegance and its up-to-date fittings and methods to need much description to the people of Lindsay and Victoria county. In the fall openings this year, however, this store surpassed itself, and this is the highest praise that could be given. Carrying the largest stock in town, larger, more varied and full of charm than even in previous years, this fine store—a credit to its progressive management, and to the County of Victoria a matter of pride—this store was one of the chief centres of attraction.

For the opening, Dundas & Flavelle had a magnificent showing of the newest and choicest in millinery. This department is in charge of Miss Taylor, head milliner, and Miss Eastman, head trimmer, and is a veritable garden of beauty. The millinery rooms are elegantly fitted up, the parlors were brightly lighted, and the charming display of headwear was complete in every detail.

The popular shades for this year are plum colors, Alice blue, tans and browns, and here they are shown in the prettiest effects, the most charming styles and in fashionable designs original and exclusive, to suit all tastes and all purses.

Three-quarter plumes are most fashionable for this season, marabout and stiff wings in handsome trimmings being quite stylish, and shot birds shown very much with coque feathers. A lot of Dresden ribbon is also being used and lots of flowers shown, large roses being in the ascendant. Some of the dainty and modish designs utterly defy description, and must be seen to be appreciated. To tempt the lady readers of The Watchman-Wardener to visit this big display of the latest and best in millinery, the following notes on some of the special styles are given.

One of the attractive showings is a pale blue flop with tan crown, band silver embroidered. This handsome model is completed with bird towards back, with shot greens and blue with coque feathers in same shades.

An Alice blue, Gainsboro shape, is another attractive design. This hat is of Alice blue velvet and ribbon, crown fairly high, made with a bow formed right from the crown, and with elegant, Alice blue plume to the side front.

The Strand shape is another very popular line of English pattern. This is a large shape of black velvet, with taffeta face. An Alsatian bow of black velvet with three large black plumes completes a handsome design.

In tan shade, a very attractive shape is shown. This is a shape that rolls off face, turned in front, rim of leather colored maline with tan velvet trimming. A soft crown of all over lace, with tan feather coming towards the back, finished with rosette of tan ribbon and Gainsboro pin, completes this picture.

In mourning goods, Dundas & Flavelles have a most complete and effective showing. One design in this line is made of folded down taffeta, trimmed with wings and a knot and

In fashionable purple there is shown a large hat of amethyst velvet, trimmed in soft tones of ribbon and flowers, with Paradise sprays and amethyst pins. This handsome model shows one of the latest and newest shades.

One of the much admired designs is a champagne satin flop, faced with soft blue velvet, trimmed in shot shaded brown and blue ribbon, soft blue wings to match.

One of the dainty designs in the popular tan effect was a small hat trimmed with ruching of tan Duchess ribbon around crown, with the brim caught tight to crown on left side by a bunch of wing and finished with a knot of ribbon and Gainsboro pins. This creation is one of the most exquisite of the original designs shown in millinery in town.

Violet is one of the popular colors. This fashionable shade is shown here in many charming effects. One model is a large shape, velvet, faced in with white maline, trimmed on top around the crown with small violet flowers and finished at the front with violet rosettes, and Paradise spray on left side.

Miss Bannon's parlors are well situated, well lighted, and the general consensus of opinion of the many who visited during the opening was that variety, originality and fashionable effects were here in beauty and profusion.

Miss Mitchell's Fall Millinery Opening.

With the advent of the fall season, Miss Mitchell, as usual, is showing a full stock of millinery goods in the latest and most charming styles and comprising everything that will be in demand.

For the opening, the parlors were

beautifully and tastefully decorated with colored chiffons, trays of flowers, wings and fancy feathers of all descriptions, and the many visitors who went through on the opening days were more than delighted with the general aspect.

The drooping shapes which were so popular during the summer season, are still in vogue. Fancy feathers, flowers, foliage, felt and beaver hats, ribbons and plateaux are used extensively. Trimmed hats, exquisite creations of the latest designs, are being produced at these parlors at reasonable prices.

One very pretty model was shown here in the drooping shape, covered plainly with tan couche velvet and trimmed with plaiting of two shades of tan ribbon, finished at left side with flowers of harmonizing shade, and at the right folds of ribbon caught to crown with fancy pin and folding to brim.

Another much admired design was in rich black velvet, with narrow front and long drooping back, the only trimming being a knot of velvet in front, and two long handsome coque plumes falling at either side of the crown.

The visitors had much praise for a handsome creation in black velvet with wide brim rolling upward at left front, over which fell two stylish ostrich feathers, and two simple rolls of satin ribbon thrust with a silver pin.

In the popular shades of brown attention naturally turned to an elegant design in brown felt, with puff crown of velvet in corresponding shade, trimmed exclusively with wings of lighter shade daintily arranged at sides and back.

The whole display at these parlors was an elegant showing of choice effects in fashionable headwear.

As in the case of the other displays in Lindsey the English language is inadequate to fittingly describe the charming effects, the handsome designs and the modish showings at Wakely's. Fashion, quality and artistic taste have most clearly been at work in these parlors.

One of the handsome models is a large military hat in tan, with plain black moire facing and a huge tan pom pom at side, that completes a very attractive design.

The season's hats tend to large shapes, and at these parlors is shown several elegant effects in this mode. A picture hat in pale blue, with dainty cream lace facing and huge buckle across front, with wide side effect trimmed with pale blue roses on one side and large bows of pale blue ribbon at the other.

Another popular design is the Gainsboro. This is shown in black, trimmed at left side, two large and sweeping plumes falling towards the back, two narrow white satin cords, and folded white satin side crown held in place with large steel buckle.

Another charming design is a pale blue velvet picture hat, plain black facing, with huge draped crown, made of narrow cream lace. Three large roses nestle softly at left hand side in pale colors of pink, tan and mauve.

One of the extreme New York styles

shown is the stove pipe crown, straight up at either side, shaded sight. This has two wings standing brown ribbon holding them together, with huge jet buckle.

A stunning Parisian shape that was much admired has the front and extreme long back, in form of folds of maline, held in place by sequin band attached at either side with jet buckles at either side from the crown. Two large plumes sweep down the back, held on top by a single tailored bow of maline.

For the opening this fall several new ideas were introduced and successfully carried out, at this store, among others being the American idea of displaying carpets through the whole store floor front. This was one of the attractive features of Kent street in the evenings during the fair, and the carpet helps display was a handsome and tasty showing of elegant goods in an elegant way. Mr. S. Ferguson was responsible for these features and the very flattering comments made on the showing are his reward for artistic labor.

The full line of goods for ladies and gents as carried on the ground floor are complete in every particular and all lines are reasonable, fashionable and well displayed.
