A youthful tow-headed prisoner of 19 summers, answering to the name of Benjamin J. Madison, appeared in police court this morning on a serious charge. He had arrived in town about four weeks ago after a six month's graduating course at the prison farm. The array of jewelry, knives, razors, shoes, handkerchiefs, cuff buttons, watches and pocket books which were displayed on table told the tale of Madison's exploits since coming home.


