Eldon's Big Fall Exhibition Attracted Thousands of Visitors--Baseball Tournament Feature of the Day--Woodville Won Twice

Woodville, Sept. 12.—Under weather conditions that were perfect, a large crowd from the countryside flocked to the Eldon Agricultural Society's annual fall fair early in the morning.

The most interesting feature of the horse show was a team of heavy draughts, grey Percherons, four and five years old, shown by the well-known horseman, Charlie Cowan, of Cannington.

The lady driving competition was another interesting event, with Mrs. Roddy, of Cambray, carrying off the honors: Miss Valentine, of Woodville, second, and Miss Miller third.

It will be remembered that four years ago Woodville cut out what they called the "fixed" horse races, and replaced them with a baseball tournament, which the directors claim has been a huge success.

The final game between Lindsay and Woodville was the surprise of the season, and a good game from start to finish, as "Lefty" Heppenstall had the Lindsay sluggers at his mercy, and up to the last innings they only registered one hit of his delivery.

The first game was a hummer between the old-time rivals, Woodville and Cannington. Cannington arrived two players short, and were allowed to play Lennie, of Lindsay, behind the bat, and Campbell, of Lindsay, in left field.
