CHEESE SHIPMENTS LOWER THAN IN TWO PREVIOUS YEARS

More Butter was Also Shipped in 1899 than in This Year—Mr. Flavelle Comments

Cheese Shipped Since May 1st this year 1,380,545 In same period last year 1,704,323 In same period in 1899 1,580,378

Butter Shipped Since May 1st this year 331,530 During same period last year 232,835 During same period in 1899 409,487

The above table shows the number of pounds of cheese and butter shipped from Montreal up to Oct. 12 in this and the two preceding years.

Not many of them expected that to this date, more cheese was sent from Montreal both last year and in 1899 than this year.

When this fact was brought to the notice of Mr. W. Flavelle he said: "That seems strange and it is difficult to tell exactly what it is."

Canadian exporters have likely hoped that the market would go up, and kept their cheese in stock.

I am of the opinion that when the final shipments are made they will be so heavy as to justify the statement that the goods were being held for higher prices.

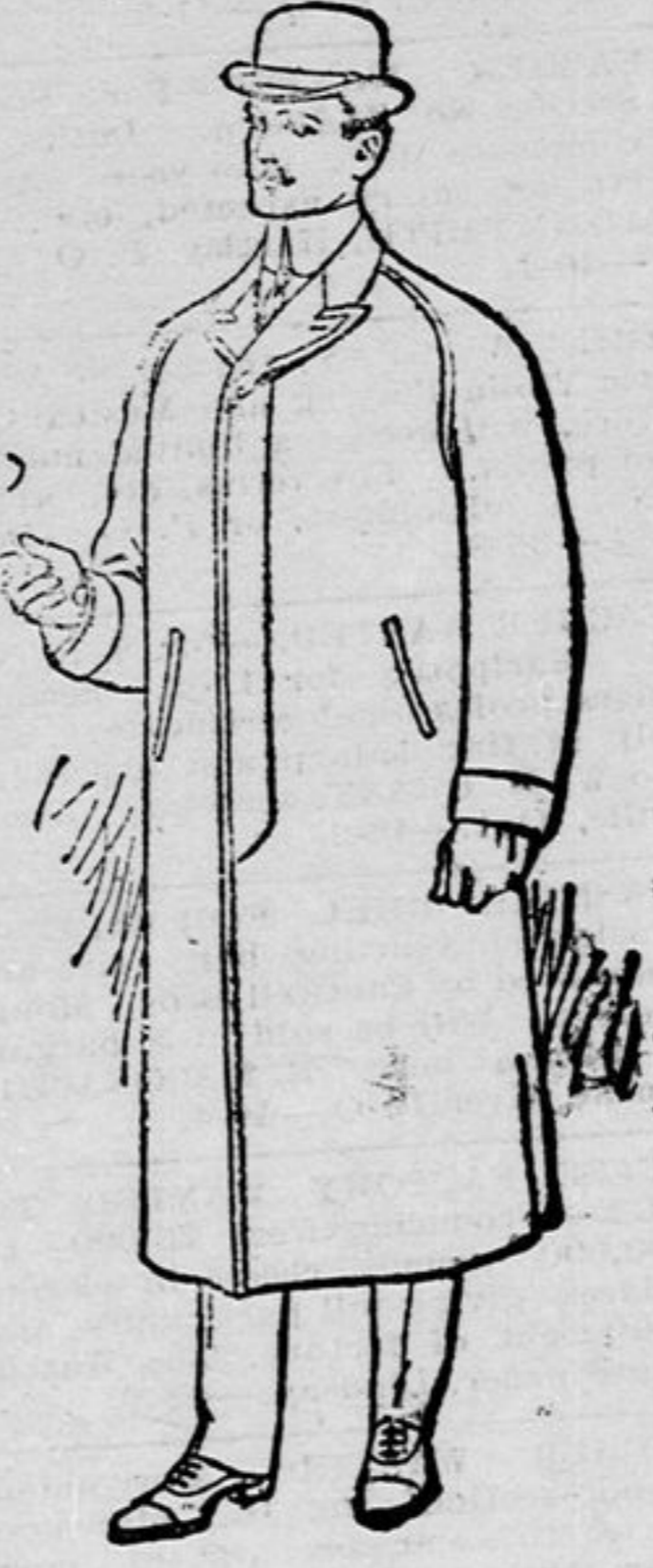
