Textile Strike Nearing the End

Lawrence, "ass., Sent. 30.-The question of terminating or continuing the strike in the Lawrence Textile Mills, called last Thursday as a protest against the imprisonment of Etter and Giovannitti the Industrial Workers of the World organizers, was expected to be settled at a mass meeting of the industrial workers of Lawrence Common Saturday afternoon. The strike continued Saturday, despite the vote of operatives at several meetings to return to their machines. It was estmated that 8,000 hands were idle, divided among the different mills as follows: Wood 4,500; Ayer, 1,500; Washington, 2,000; Prospect, 200; Ar lington, 300; Everett, 300; Pacific, 175. There was no trouble of any kind when the mill gates opened and the strikers did not post any pickets.


