Maclaren Differs from Herriman

In last issue we published a letter from Dr. Herriman, president of the local prohibition executive in which he said that the Dominion Alliance had decided to take prohibition out of Dominion politics and that it is not an issue in this election.

Mr. J. J. Maclaren, chairman of the Dominion Alliance appears to have a different understanding of what that body decided upon. A circular letter condemning the government for its treatment of the plebiscite ends as follows:—

The Alliance Executive calls attention to the fact that the government and parliament have united to sustain liquor traffic, in defiance of the people's wishes, and in violation of what the public have accepted as an agreement that the traffic was to be outlawed if the people voted against it.

Friends of the temperance cause are therefore earnestly urged to take a more active part than ever in political affairs, identifying themselves with political organizations, attending political primaries and conventions, and doing their utmost to secure the nomination and election for the Dominion parliament of men who can be relied upon to be true to the prohibition cause.

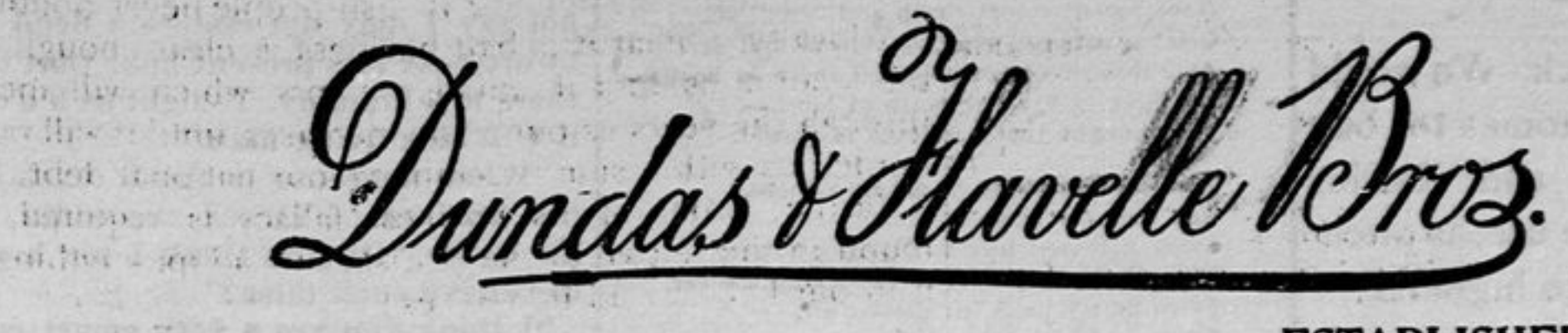
There was an unusually large audience at St. Paul's on Sunday night. The decorations of fruits and grains were still in the building after the recent Harvest Home services.

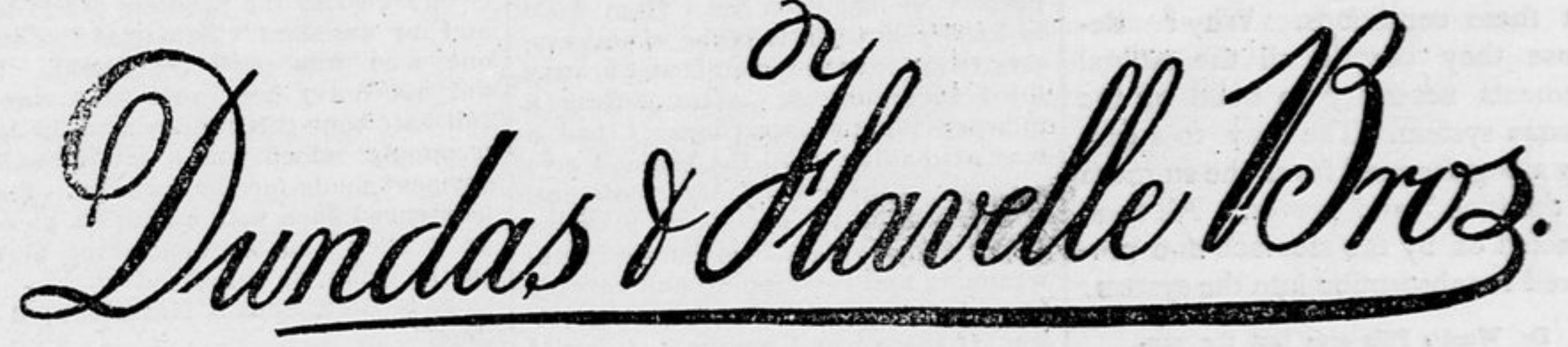
