**Rennie Concludes That the Lindsay is all Right**

The Sun reporter got hold of some who were down here a few weeks ago inspecting the plots of the test plots and the collections of samples made by Mr. Rennie the following follows:

"Mr. Rennie returned to Lindsay this week after having spent this week after having spent this week in inspecting the test plots about Whitby, and Lindsay, and in getting samples of the beets to be analyzed by the O.A.C. for analysis. 'There were', said Mr. Rennie, 'beets in the neighborhood of the Port Perry district, the country surrounding the plots in the Lindsay district, and over an unproductive area. I had to drive to the plots in the Lindsay district that drive I passed far much better adapted to the production of beets than some of the plots in the Lindsay district.'"

"The Whitby district was probably about the best of the town there is admirably adapted for the production of beets. There is also some land in Mariposa and the Lindsay district."

"Enough Land for a Factory there enough land, suitable production, to justify the investment of a factory there," was asked.

"Well," was the reply, "there are 5,000 acres in beets in the Lindsay district. That means to arrange for the proper crops, that you should have 5,000 acres within the Lindsay district for best production. The Lindsay and Lindsay districts, they certainly have suitable to the purpose. I do not know but enough of a factory at each end of the Lindsay district. It will pay to haul beets even then the driver will keep on moving to get in a day. The bulk of the Lindsay district, they are admirably provided with stretching into the Lindsay county."

"Would Farmers Grow Them?"

"There is, however, another factor to be taken into account, that is the willingness of the farmer to engage in beet culture. I saw a few of them who would raise a few of them, but the majority would like to see the Lindsay means of adding to their property; and it is in that whole area there altogether too much is placed on grain raising, with wheat, oats, as it was when there is a pretty slow way of making money, and it is a dead end, overproducing the land."

"Of course beet culture would deal of labor, and there is complaint on this score. In this advantage compared with turnips: all the harvesting, if implemented as soon as the beets are over before having the beets are put in at the Lindsay, in proper condition, ground is kept well cultivated. It will be such a mass of top work in July that it will be impossible to get the plants. And the harvesting comes on late as is over."
