Wireless Preferred to Cable. Sydney, N. S., Nov. 4.-The Dominion Government cable steamer Building-Tyrian left this port yesterday morning to lay a cable from Gro se ten miles, and from Bryan Island to

Anticosti, a distance of 110 miles. Government Engineer Keeley, who installed the wireless telegraphy station at Belle Isle, will have charge ten years in Kingston penitentiary of laying the cable. He said yesterday that the Dominion Government's wireless station at Belle Isle was working perfectly and the system was so easy of operation that the operators used it in preference to the cable, which also connected the points linked by the Marconi sys-


