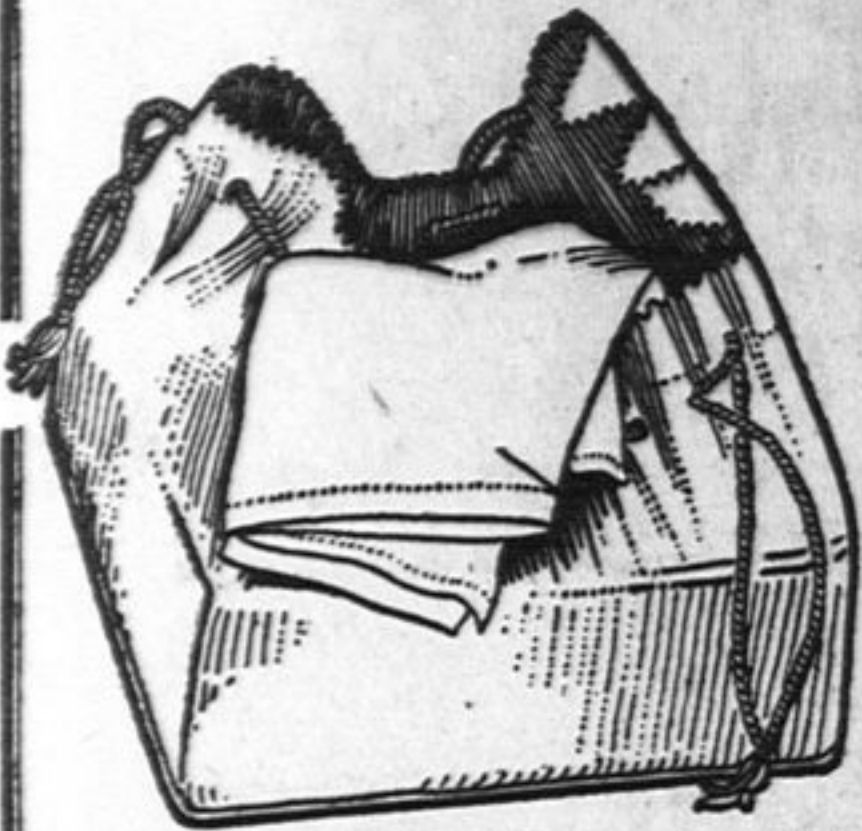

Liverpool and Chicago Wheat Futures Close Higher—Live Stock—Latest Quotations.

Tuesday Evening, Nov. 9. Liverpool wheat futures closed to-day 1/4d to 1/2d higher than yesterday; corn 1/4d lower.

CATTLE MARKETS.

Cables Stronger—Hogs Active and Five Cents Higher at Buffalo.

LONDON, Nov. 9.—London cables for cattle are higher; at 12 1/2c to 13 1/4c per lb.

Toronto Live Stock. TORONTO, Nov. 9.—Receipts of live stock at the City Market, as reported by the railways, were 98 carloads, consisting of 1532 cattle, 1386 hogs, 950 sheep and lambs and 94 calves.

Butchers. Geo. Rowntree bought 360 butchers for the Harris Abattoir Company butchers' steers and heifers, \$3.35 to \$5.20; cows at \$1.50 to \$4.65; bulls at \$2.25 to \$4.14.

Stockers and Feeders. H. Murby reported a light run of feeders and stockers at unchanged prices from those given last week.

Milkers and Springers. About 40 milkers and springers were on sale. Prices ranged from \$35 to \$60 each.

Veal Calves. Receipts light; prices firm, at \$3 to \$6.50 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs. D. Rowntree bought for Westey Dunn 500 lambs at \$5.65, average price; 150 sheep at \$3.90, average price.

Hogs. Mr. Harris quotes selects at \$7.65, fed and watered, and \$7.40 f.o.b. cars at country points.

East Buffalo Cattle Market. EAST BUFFALO, Nov. 9.—Cattle—Receipts, 100 head; steady; prime steers, \$6.75 to \$7.

Veals—Receipts, 150 head; active and 25c lower, \$6 to \$8.75.

Hogs—Receipts, 420 head; active and steady to 5c higher on heavy, slow and steady on light; heavy, \$8.15 to \$8.25; roughs, \$7.20 to \$7.35.

Sheep and Lambs—Receipts, 1000 head; active; sheep steady; lambs 10c higher; lambs, \$6 to \$7.50; Canada lambs, \$7.25 to \$7.35.

New York Live Stock. NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Beaves—Receipts, 687; nothing doing; feeling firm. Exports to-morrow, 2600 quarters of beef.

Calves—Receipts, 887; veals steady; grassers dull; westerns steady; veals, \$2.25 to \$3.50; few choice, \$3.75; grassers, \$3.25 to \$3.50; westerns, \$4.00 to \$4.65.

Sheep and Lambs—Receipts, 4247; sheep steady; lambs strong; sheep, \$2.50 to \$4.50; culls, \$2; lambs, \$6.50 to \$7.50; culls, \$4.50 to \$5.50.

Hogs—Receipts, 4534, all for slaughterers; nominally steady, at \$8 to \$8.25; pigs, \$7.50 to \$8.
