With regard to the recent test of the Lindsay ozone purification plant and the report printed in another column, Secretary Ray was interviewed by a Watchman man this morning.

Mr. Ray thinks that if the Provincial Board of Health were a little more in harmony with the work of the plant, instead of "knocking" it, better results would be reported.

"I am perfectly satisfied that Mr. Bridge will make the plant what he started out to do," said Mr. Ray, "and the plant is going to be a success. The report printed in last evening's papers is not what was given out by the men who made the test," continued the secretary, "a complete report will be ready for publication in a short time."

COMMISSIONER BRADY Commissioner Brady says with regard to the subject, that he had not seen the item in yesterday's paper, but believes the plant will be a success.
