### COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS

#### WEDNESDAY'S BESSION

The county council committee on printing met in the judge's chamber at 2.30 yesterday afternoon with Councillor Kylie in the chair.  
The new filing cases in the registrar's office necessitated a short dis-

ussion. The government inspector visited the office some time ago and demanded that the new fittings should be purchased, and Reeve Jordan thought it would be better to comply with the request. The filings are now placed in a position so that the registrar may get at deeds, mortgages, etc., handily. The present system will last for years to come.

Coun. McLean—"What is the price of these?"  
Mr. McNeillie—"Those already purchased cost \$4.50 a dozen."

On motion of Councillors Jordan and Tiers, the accounts were ordered to be paid, and as there was no other business, the committee rose.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE.**  
It was decided by the members of the council that the Finance committee should hold a short session. At this moment the press representatives were asked to retire, as the council wished to consider some House of Refuge items that will appear in a report later.

The County Property Committee met with Coun. Jordan in the chair. The accounts were read by Clerk McNeillie, and on reading Mr. Hungerford's account for some work on the steam fitting system, objection was made to the paying for a shut-off valve for the registry office.

Coun. McLean—"That was in the original specifications."  
Mr. McNeillie—"It was noticed early that such a valve was needed."

Coun. McLean—"I move the account be paid provided it was not in the original specification."

It was explained by Chairman Jordan that the boulevards around the court house had been improved with some material brought from the streets, costing nothing, but as it would not grow grass, some loam was obtained.

Mr. McNeillie informed the committee that it was necessary to purchase some utensils for the building, but the caretaker was doing good work, as might be seen by the councillors, and the conditions were much improved, both inside and out.

**JAIL INSPECTION.**  
A report of the inspection of the jail was read, which stated that everything was in a satisfactory condition, including the new porch, except the kitchen stove, which should be improved or a new one purchased.

It was moved by Councillor Kylie, seconded by Councillor McLean, that the chairman receive the usual grant of \$50 for his services. The committee rose.

#### HIGH CONSTABLE

At the meeting of the committee on appointments of the county council, held yesterday afternoon, the appointment of a high constable for the county owing to the resignation of Chief Vincent being accepted at the last session, created considerable discussion. The chief's resignation was handed to the council, as the remuneration was not large enough, (there being no salary), and consequently the by-law appointing him was repealed. No applications were received by the treasurer.

Coun. McLean stated that Chief

Vincent was a good man, but that he should not be called away for a number of days to places in the county, and a man who is not accustomed to the work put in his place.

Coun. Tiers said he had been talking to the chief, who said it didn't pay him to leave town and go to some distant part of the county. The work of the town and that of the council are closely related, and if the remuneration was made large enough he would be the man.

Coun. Kylie was in favor of a separate man being appointed, as the town needed the chief here all the time, but a good man should be given a proper fee.

After some discussion by other members of the council it was moved, seconded by Coun. Southern, that the high constable be given an honorarium of fifty dollars a year besides the customary fees. The motion carried.

On motion of Councillors' Palmer and McLeod, Mr. Wm. Thornbury was appointed to the position. The committee rose after the usual motion.

#### VICTORIA COUNTY RECEIVES

The committee appointed by the county council to meet delegates from Haliburton to enter into an agreement as to the share of charges and expenses should be paid by Haliburton, met in the court house some time ago, and decided that the said county should pay, commencing Jan. 1, 1910, the sum of \$550 per annum and that the payment should be made to the treasurer of Victoria

Co. on December 20 each year.

The committee recommended that an additional lock up be supplied for Haliburton county. The report was received this morning and read a third time and a by-law was passed fixing the amount to be paid to Victoria Co. by the neighboring county of Haliburton at \$550 per annum.

#### SCHOOL MATTERS IN EMILY

At 2.35 Tuesday afternoon the county council met in their chamber and the minutes of the last meeting were read, and on motion of Councillors Hawkins and Byng, were confirmed.

After the Warden's address, which appeared in Tuesday's issue, was read, it was moved by Coun. B. L. McLean, seconded by Mr. Corneil, that the various clauses therein be left to the different committees.

Coun. Corneil, of Emily, addressed the council in behalf of forty-nine ratepayers of the school section in a section of the township near Omees, who submitted a petition signed by them and asking that the public school section of the Omees high school be disintegrated from that institution. The petition was referred to the committee in charge, on motion of Messrs. Jordan and McLeod.

The council then adjourned to visit the County House of Refuge, and meet again on Wednesday at 10.30 a.m.

#### COUNTY DEBENTURES

Court House, Nov. 16, 11 a.m. — The county council, met this morning for business about 10.45, with

members present. The minutes of the previous meeting having been read and adopted, it was moved by Coun. Byng, seconded by Coun. Hawkins, that the report of the Little Bob bridge be received and read. The report was referred to the Roads and Bridges committee on motion of Councillors Byng and McLeod.

Moved by Coun. Jordan, seconded by Coun. Young, that the report of the committee on the Haliburton settlement be received and read. The council went into committee on the whole for the second reading on motion of Couns. Michael and Southern, Coun. Callan taking the chair. The report was read a third time and signed.

A by-law to fix the amount to be paid by Haliburton for charges and expenses was read a third time, signed and sealed.

A letter from the Lindsay Pet Stock Association asking for the usual grant and a number of sealed tenders for bridges were left to the finance committee on motion of Councillors Jordan and McLean.

The council then adjourned on motion of Councillors Callan and McKague, to meet at 10.30 to-morrow morning.
