The capital of the endowment fund is now \$18,427.96, including a bequest of \$200 by the late S. J. Fox, M.P.P.

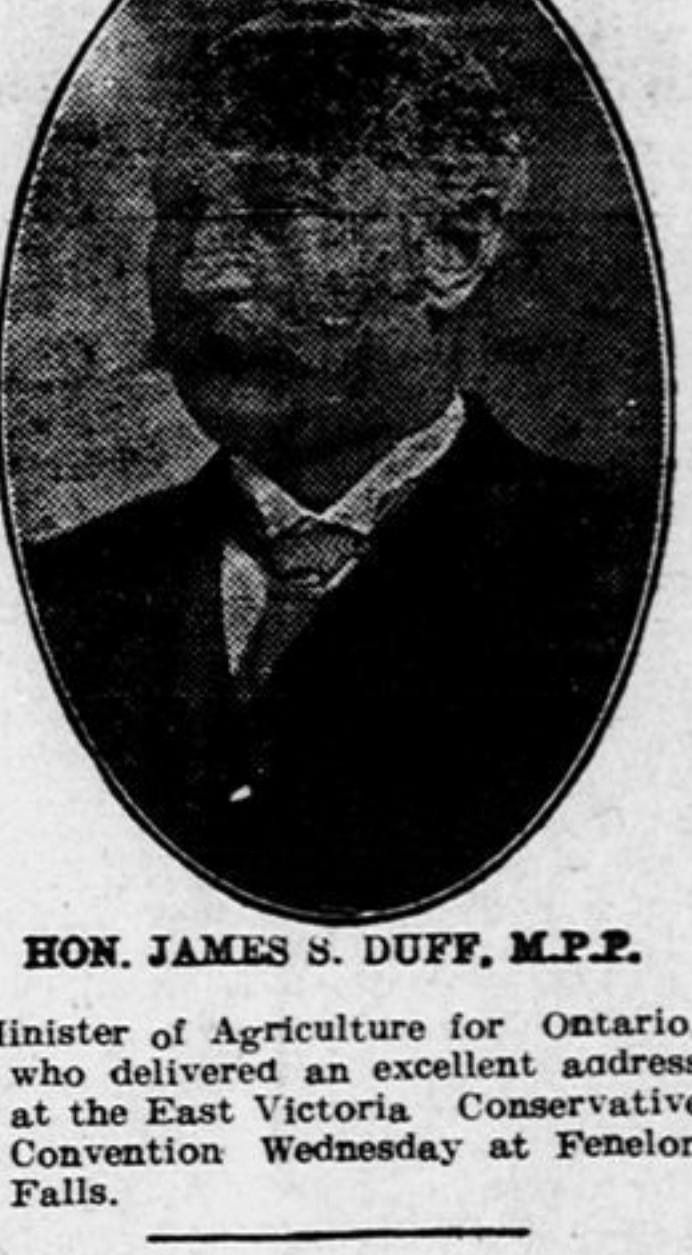
