**Prof. Hicks Predicts
A Stormy November**

Prof. H. Hicks predicts much colder weather on the 9th, 10th and 11th of this month. A regular storm period involves the 11th to the 16th, being central on the 13th. At this period the moon will be at the extreme south declination and atmosphere will flow from northerly directions, increasing the probability of cold rains and winds, added to snow and sleet over central to northern parts of the country. The Mercury and Venus periods will both be felt in the disturbances of this period, and to the end of the month. Storms of this period will culminate on the 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th—first to the west and thence progressively, day by day to the eastward. High barometer and change to westerly winds and much colder will push the western tanks of the storm centre, all the way to the Atlantic. One of the most important things to know, and keep in mind, is that rising temperature, falling barometer and fair weather precede storms, and rising barometer and colder, clearing weather will follow storms.

**British Cabinet
Defeated on
Home Rule**

London, Nov. 11.—The Cabinet was defeated to-day by a vote of 228 against 206 in the committee on the Home Rule Bill. A motion by Premier Asquith for consideration of the bill was adjourned. There has been considerable opposition by members on the Ministerial side of the House of Commons to the financial provisions of the Home Rule Bill. Some seventy Liberal members of the House have given voice to their objection to the Irish Parliament being given control of the customs, as they argue such control would enable the Irish Parliament to introduce protection. The followers of William O'Brien announced their intention of withdrawing from the House during the proceedings of the committee on the finance clauses of the bill. The Government is considering its position in view of the adverse vote in committee. The Cabinet does not necessarily have to resign and is unlikely to do so in face of the international crisis. The British Cabinet was defeated to-day by a vote of 228 against 206 on amendment proposed by the Unionist party to a financial clause of the Home Rule Bill while it was under discussion in committee of the House of Commons. The Government is now faced with three alternatives. The Cabinet can resign, it can drop the Home Rule Bill, or it can bring forward a motion to recommit the bill and obtain the opinion of the full house on the vote which was taken to-day after it has given due notice of its intention to do so. The U. S. Election

The elections in the United States resulted as was generally expected. Mr. Wilson, the Democratic candidate, is the new president. Possibly Mr. Roosevelt's appearance as a progressive candidate helped him. Staid Republicans who would naturally prefer to vote for Mr. Taft, probably did vote for the Democratic electors to make sure that the radicals of their own party should not control the nation's affairs. Mr. Taft has been a generally sober-thinking careful president, who thought to do his duty to the country. He had mistakes charged against him, however, which his opponents used to his disadvantage, and they came after his party had been long in power, and what some of its leaders appeared to forget that the party organization was but a part of the people and that party organizations were losing favor with a large class in the community. This helped the Democrats. Then the Progressive faction of the Republican party tore it from within. Mr. Roosevelt, while he is energetic, does not possess the intellectual qualities counted necessary in the creator of a new party in a great state; and there was little or nothing in his program to form the basis of a revolution in a country where the people govern themselves, well or ill, according to their strength or failings. As for Mr. Wilson, he was fortunate in the choice of his time for entering public life. He quit the presidency of a great university to become a candidate for the governorship of New Jersey. He was elected, and though in his capacity as governor he has done little of real import, his success and his past record caught the fancy of the people. He won the nomination of his party and now has won the presidency of the nation. He will have at the start, at least, a house of representatives favorable to his views and to support him in his program the great moral force of his present success. He should be able to keep the moderate pledges as to tariff reform, etc., he has made.
