Electric Power for Farmers In Township of Mariposa

It will not be long until the farmers in West Ops and in Mariposa township will be sitting in their easy chairs, pipes in their mouths and feet cocked up in front of their fireplaces, while out in the yard or in the big barn the chores are being done mechanically and with routine regularity by the aid of electric current supplied by the Seymour Power Company. Before the above company gained access to the Town of Lindsay a promise was made that they would come to the aid of the farmers, and before long it is proposed to carry out that promise. During the days of the Lindsay Central Fair a large number of farmers examined the fine exhibit made by this company, and the enthusiasm was aroused; the result being that recently many farmers in Mariposa township have agreed to buy current, and it is expected that the company will very shortly commence installation operations by erecting a transmission line. This will be done free of cost to the farmer, who will be called upon only to pay the running expenses.

Hockey Prospects--Town League and Intermediate Team

The first gun in the local hockey situation was fired last evening in Mr. A. M. Paton's office, when a number of hockey enthusiasts assembled and talked over the prospects for the coming season. Three propositions were placed before them, but nothing was decided upon. The propositions were to place a junior or an intermediate team in the O.H.A. or a team in the Trent Valley League.

The placing of teams in the O.H.A. did not meet with the approval of all present as many were of the impression that the material available was not fast enough for Junior O.H.A., although a good intermediate team could be placed on the ice. A well-known local concern is very anxious to place last year's winners of the Hughes cup in the Trent Valley league so that they will be able to defend the cup this coming season. If they played O.H.A. hockey they could not compete for the Hughes cup as O.H.A. players are barred.

MONTENEGRINS ARE CHIVALROUS

Traveller Tells Some Interesting Information

London, Nov. 14.—Some interesting information about the Montenegrins is supplied by a traveller who is familiar with the little kingdom, and who recently returned to London. "Montenegro," he says, "is the only country in Europe where a wife may be regarded as a paragon of insurance policy." The explanation of this curious statement he says, in an interview published in the Daily Mirror:

Even Turk is safe. "The Montenegrin is intensely chivalrous. The same remark applies to the Albanian kinsmen, and a woman's honour is safer in the hands of these reckless fighters than in almost any European capital. This respect for women is carried to such a pitch that, although the very word 'Turk' affects the natives as does a red rag to an infuriated bull, yet a Turkish traveller, finding himself in the wilds of the Montenegrin mountains, would be absolutely safe were he accompanied by his wife. A Montenegrin would sooner let his enemy slip out of his hands than run the risk of accidentally hurting a woman. This trait is so well known that travellers in that turbulent country, who have some definite idea of returning home alive, make certain of it by being accompanied by their wives."

Wife is slave at home. "While the lives of women in Montenegro are untroubled by fear of sudden death, it cannot be said that the woman has a very good time. They are little better than beasts of burden, without the relaxation of gossip, for, unlike the other Balkan peoples, the Montenegrins are very reserved. When there is no fighting, the Montenegrin sits in his village inn, drinking coffee and smoking cigarettes.

The Montenegrin husband is absolute lord and master over his wife. By the custom of the people a woman does not address her husband first, always waiting for him to speak. The arduous lot of the women has a decided effect upon their looks, and the Montenegrin women can hardly be regarded as beautiful.

Unlike their sisters in Serbia and Bulgaria, they do not pay much attention to dress, the reasons being that there is little money in the country, and that the never-ending vendettas have a habit of turning whole villages of women into widows.

EDUCATION SNEERED AT. "Recently Montenegro has been going in for schools. Like almost everything else in the country, there are some Russians. Education is not, however, in great repute in Montenegro, where it is regarded as somewhat effeminate."

Some further information about the life of the Montenegrins was given by Mme. Mitrovitch, who lived for some years in the country. She said: "The most noticeable habit of the men is their laziness. They stroll and saunter about the streets, smoking and talking, while the women do the work. But the men are very fierce and warlike, and always wear

in their belts pistols and daggers. Unmarried girls wear little, tight-fitting black and red caps. The red represents the blood shed by their countrymen in fighting their enemies, and the black is a symbol of mourning for the dead. The married women do not wear caps, but place a black veil at the back of their heads which streams down to the waist. "The children have but little education, and in the schools that do exist only Russian is spoken. Every educated Montenegrin acquires his knowledge outside his own country."

Ottawa, Nov. 15.—The damming of the St. Lawrence at two points between Montreal and Prescott is proposed in two gigantic power schemes, now before the Borden Government for consideration.

The Long Sault Development Co., the Aluminum Company of America, the Eastern Canada Power Company, Sir Max Aitken and D. Lorne McGibbon, and other eminent Montreal, English and United States capitalists, are laying plans for the damming of the St. Lawrence above the Long Sault Rapids from the American to the Canadian side, and of developing 800,000 electrical horsepower power. The second scheme involves the bringing of the level of the St. Lawrence in the vicinity of Coteau, Cedar, Split Rock and Cascade Rapids to the level of the water in Lake St. Francis, which would provide a head of 85 feet and dam the water at Cascade Point to the Cornwall canal.
