STIRRING MEETING IN TOWN-MANY NAMES PROPOSED - IN FENELON FALLS-IN OPS-MARIPOSA, VERULAM, EMILY, ELDON, SOMERVILLE AND OTHERS.

Because Monday was Christmas day, municipal nominations were held on Friday.

In Lindsay, the hour had been fixed for 7.30 instead of 12 o'clock and a large audience occupied the town hall when Clerk Knowlson declared the nominations closed at 8.30.
