Stark, a trick bicycle rider and diver, whose feat of riding down an inclined plane on a bicycle and diving from a height of forty feet into a shallow tank was to have been the feature of the amateur circus at the Twenty-second regiment armoury, New York, Saturday aftermoon, was instantly killed during the , c. formance as the result of the dive he undertook to make. Owing to nervousness, the result, it is said, of attending the funeral of his fiancee only a few hours before, Stark apparently miscalculated the distance of his dive and plunged into the water at the end instead of the middle of the tank. His head struck the bottom of the tank and his skull was fractured. The accident was witnessed by 3,000 people, all of whom were filled with horror. Stark's sister was among the spectators, and fainted when she saw her brother plunge to his death.
