Ops Council Proceedings

As prescribed by the municipal act, Ops council met on Dec. 15th, at the usual hour, all members present. The minutes of last meeting were read by the clerk, and on motion by Messrs. Hawkins and Hickson, were duly confirmed.

Bearing on the Communications Dr. Clarke's account for medical attendance on Mrs. Gould was considered, and as her illness was distressing, the account was passed.

Treasurer's Financial Statement Mr. John Kennedy, treasurer, laid on the table a detailed annual statement of receipts and expenditures since Dec. 15th, '99.

The Payment of Taxes Mr. John Jackson collector presented his roll, saying that he had made an honest effort to have all the taxes in by the 14th, but some who had promised to meet him and pay up had not yet done so.

Rather than close the roll and return the list of arrears to the County treasurer, the council decided to extend the time a week or so to give Mr. Jackson a chance to enforce, if necessary, the payment of the balance, and a motion to that effect was passed, to which the corporate seal was attached.

No Salary Attached Jno. Hickson moved, seconded by Mr. Hawkins, that the road scraper procured for work on drain No. 1 be placed in charge of F. Finnegan, pathmaster beat No. 9.—arrid.

Two By-Laws Passed Mr. Byrne moved seconded by Mr. Hawkins, that a by-law to levy a special tile drainage rate on W. 1/2 lot 15, con. 4, be read the first time, and also the by-law appointing deputy-returning officers, polling booths, etc., for the municipal elections, Jan. 7th, 1901.

The Account is Closed Moved by Mr. McLean and seconded by Mr. Byrne that \$9.25 be paid to county treasurer, balance of account for stone crusher.—Carried.

Field Bridges, Drain No. 1 Moved by Mr. Hawkins and seconded by Mr. Byrne that the clerk notify the patrons of drain No. 1 of the sums awarded by the township engineer for field bridges, and that this council meet as a court of revision at 10 a.m. on Friday, Dec. 28th, 1900, to consider and decide any appeals from said award and to make the necessary estimate for the final completion of said drain.—Carried.

Cleaned the Slate On motion by Messrs. Hawkins and Hickson, the reeve issued orders in payment of sundry small accounts which had been duly examined and passed by council.
