ISSUE OF DEBENTURES FOR THE PURPOSE OF A PUBLIC LIBRARY. WHEREAS a By-law of the Muni-

cipal Council of the Town of Lindsay was passed on the Ninth day of January, A. D. 1899, establishing a Public Library in this Municipality under the Public Libraries Act; AND WHEREAS a sum of Two Thousand Dollars is required for the purpose of purchasing a site for the erection of a building for the said Public Library as appears by the special estimate for that purpose furnished by the Lindsay Public Lib-

rary Board to the Council; AND WHEREAS for the purpose aforesaid it is necessary to create a debt to the extent of Two Thousand Dollars and to issue Debentures therefor in the manner herinafter


