Corporation of the Town of Lindsay By-Law No.

A By-Law to extend the Term of Office of all Members of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Lindsay to two years.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Lindsay, enacts as follows:

The term of office of all members of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Lindsay, hereafter elected, shall be extended to the term of two years, the said persons to hold office until their successors are elected or appointed or sworn into office and the new Council is organized.

This by-law shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.

That the votes of the electors of the Town of Lindsay shall be taken on this by-law at the same hour, on the same day, at the same place and by the same Deputy Returning Officers as is provided for the next annual municipal election for the Municipal Council of the said Town of Lindsay, that is to say, on the seventh day of January, 1907.

That on Friday, the twenty-eighth day of December, 1906, the Mayor of the said Corporation shall attend at the office of the Clerk of the said Council, at the Town Hall, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to appoint persons to attend at the polling places aforesaid and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this by-law respectively.

That the Clerk of the Council of the said Corporation shall attend at his said office at eleven o'clock in the forenoon on Tuesday, the eighth day of January, 1907, to sum up the number of votes for and against the said by-law.

Read a first and second time this 6th day of November, 1906.

NOTICE

Take notice that the above is a true copy of a proposed by-law which has been taken into consideration and which will finally be passed by the Corporation of the Town of Lindsay after one month from the first publication thereof in the Watchman-Warder, the date of the first publication being the sixth day of December, 1906, and that the votes of the said electors of the said Municipality will be taken thereon at the same hour, on the same day, at the same place, and by the same Deputy Returning Officers as for the municipal elections for the year 1907, as provided in the said by-law.

By-Law No. A By-Law to Raise by way of Loan \$20,000.00 to improve the Water works System.

WHEREAS the corporation of the Town of Lindsay has heretofore purchased and constructed under the Municipal Act and the Municipal Waterworks Act, a system of waterworks for the said Corporation and has raised the money for the purchase and construction thereof upon the whole assessable property of the said Corporation under by-laws lawfully passed.

AND WHEREAS it is now necessary and desirable to extend and improve the said waterworks system by putting in a proper system of filtration and it has been estimated by the Board of Water Commissioners, for the Town of Lindsay, that the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars will be required for that purpose.

AND WHEREAS for the purpose aforesaid it is necessary to create a debt to the extent of \$20,000, and to issue debentures therefor in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

AND WHEREAS \$1537.53 is the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate for a period of twenty years for paying the said debt, and interest thereon at four and one-half per cent per annum in instalments in accordance with the terms of this by-law, so that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year shall be equal, as nearly as may be, to what is payable for interest and principal during each of the other years for such period.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Lindsay, according to the last revised assessment roll, is the sum of \$2,364,225.00.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Town of Lindsay, secured by special rates, or assessments, is \$409,711.43 (\$198,827.61 of which is debt for local improvements, waterworks system and loans made by the said Corporation) and no part of the said principal or interest of the said existing debenture debt is in arrears.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LINDSAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- That for the purposes aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Mayor of the said Corporation, and he hereby is authorized and required to cause debentures of the said Town of Lindsay to be made, executed and issued to the amount of \$20,000, in sums of not less than one hundred dollars, payable in annual instalments on the 15th day of December in each year, for twenty years, for the following amounts for principal and interest for the following years, respectively, that is to say:
