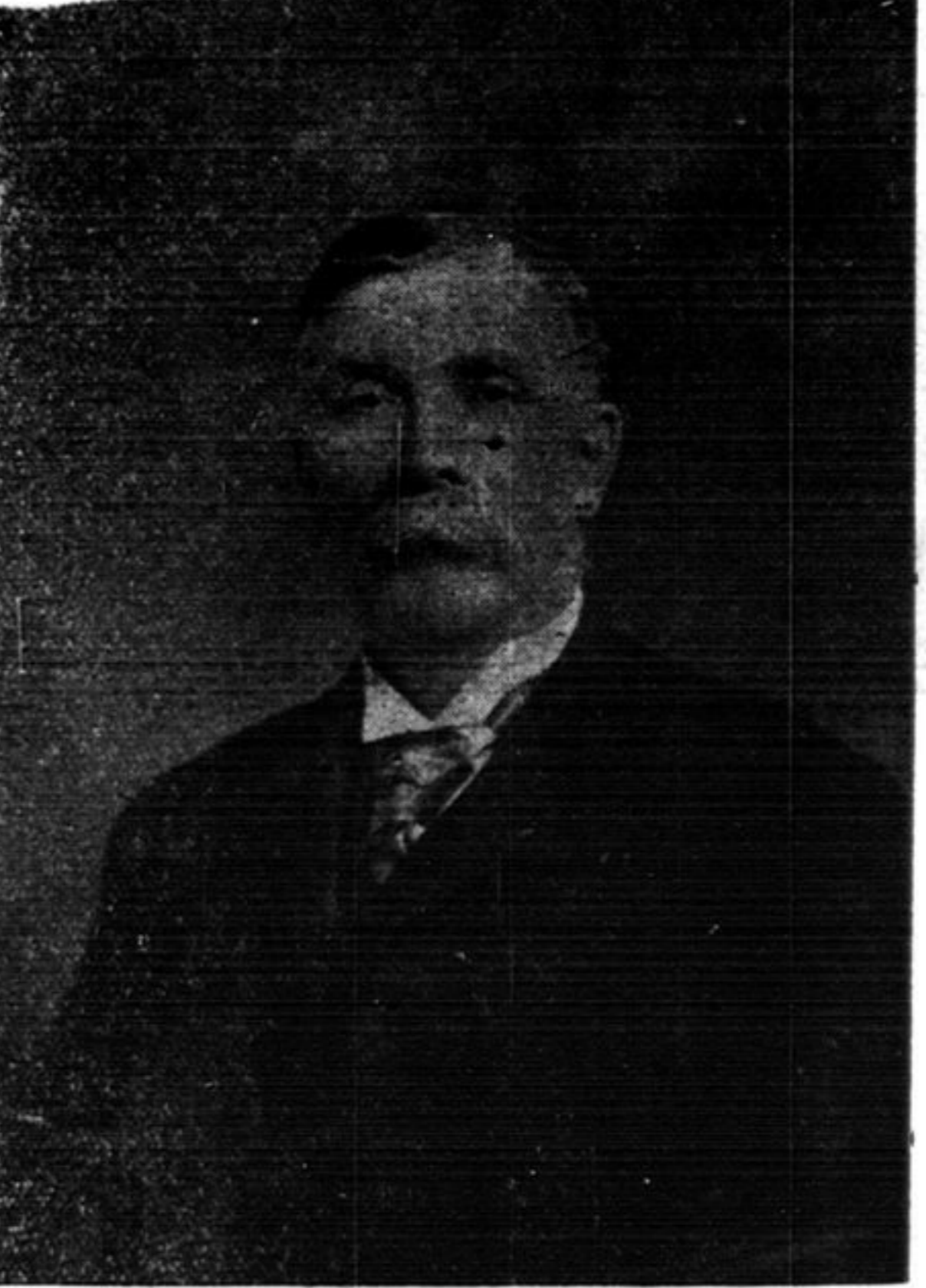

Head of Sons of England Honored by Westminster Lodge, Supreme Officers and Citizens of Lindsay, at Pym's Hotel

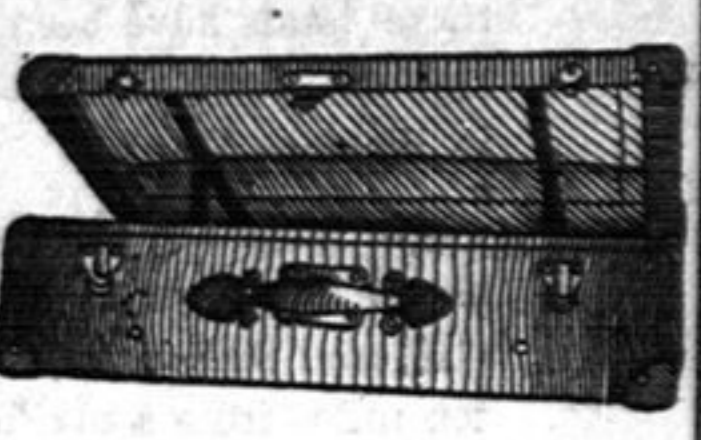
