Construction of New C.P.P. Line to be Commenced Soon Last week's Orillia Packet says: "The Toronto Construction Company expects to begin work on the C.P.R.'s Georgian Bay and Seaboard, line within the next two weeks, having received instructions to go on with its construction at once. The officials here do not know the point at which the work will begin. It is said that the Grand Trunk recently approached the C.P.R. with a proposition that they would double track the Midland and give the C.P.R. the use of the line for their through traffic on easy terms, the G.T.R. to retain control of the local traffic. The news that work is to be begun by the C.P.R. at once would indicate that this proposal, if made, did not meet with favourable consideration." This is the line which has been surveyed through Lindsay, and as well as the double tracking of the Grand Trunk from Midland to Belleville is good news for this town and vicinity.
