The Essential Parts of Good Poultry Houses

In a press bulletin from the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, W. R. Graham, B.S.A., says: The poultry houses I have seen on many of the farms in Ontario are mostly of two kinds—those that are small, poorly lighted, and seldom cleaned; and those that are well built and well lighted, and frequently kept moderately clean.

For a number of years we have been trying to find some way to overcome these difficulties. The best means of ventilating a house, that I know of, is by using cloth screens, and to keep a house perfectly dry I have found nothing better than a straw loft.
