Limited Liability

Events are shaping for a Canadian navy. Not to-day nor to-morrow, but still at no distant time. The waters of two oceans wash our shores. On the Pacific, we, and not Great Britain must face the nations as a power. Our national life has, until recently, centred in the east and on the Atlantic, where Britannia still rules the waves. But Canada is changing its aspect and at no distant time the hub of our new nationality will be in the west and its outlook is naturally Pacific.

Canada, therefore, must join hands in the Pacific with Australia, New Zealand, and with those British settlements which even now are stirring with imperial sentiments. In the Atlantic we can still unite with the motherland. But in each ocean it is inevitable that we will have a fleet.

Is there anything in that aspiration that requires us to attempt to question our responsibility as part of the British Empire? Even if our fleets fly a red ensign are they to ignore the call of the Union Jack. If war comes, as it may, will Canada be willing to wait to see how the British navy fares before clearing the decks for action? We cannot be a part of the British Empire with limited liability. Is it to be "Britain and Canada," or merely "Canada Limited"?

Christmas Gifts

Too much attention cannot be given to the question of suitable Christmas presents and we are glad to notice that there is an organized movement in the United States among prominent women to discourage the custom of giving useless things as Yuletide favors. This movement originated among the very rich people who could afford to spend money lavishly at this season, but who see no necessity of setting an example to those who are not richly endowed. Because of the practice of exchanging gifts among friends and acquaintances a heavy financial burden is often entailed to keep up appearances and the work of selection so as not to duplicate or to give something not in taste, often drives women to the verge of nervous prostration. The practice robs the holiday of real happiness and the genuine sentiments of affection and cordiality that normally belong to them. The chain system or exchanging gifts destroys the real sentiment and makes the giving merely perfunctory. If we would allow each gift to represent genuine sentiment we would be doing something worth while this year.

John Carew Lumber Company Camps Fitted Out For Ensuing Season—Company Tugs Busy

The John Carew Lumber Company's steamer, Arthur C. made the last lockage of the season Friday, when it came through the locks to dry-dock on the ways at the foot of Ridout-st.

The steamer has been kept very busy all summer and did all the towing that two boats did last year. This was accomplished by the Arthur C. only coming up the river as far as the sawmill, where the cribs were taken hold of by the alligator-punt and warped up.

The boat and Alligator were busy all day yesterday getting up cribs to keep the mill running till Christmas. At present the river is lined with logs from the bridge down past the mill. There is enough logs on hand to keep the sawmill running two or three weeks, and if the weather keeps good there will be a record cut.

On account of the snow the cribs had to quit cribbing, but there is a good big block of hemlock logs at Fenelon Falls which will be cribbed first thing next spring.

The company have a camp of thirty-five men under William Paterson, about fifteen miles below Buckhorn. This camp will take out about two million feet of green pine, which will come down the Massasauga.

Sandy Logan is Foreman of Camp No. 2, with thirty men. His camp is about six miles east of Bobcay-

During the evening a splendid vocal duet was rendered by Bro. T. P. Murtagh and Bro. J. Gray.

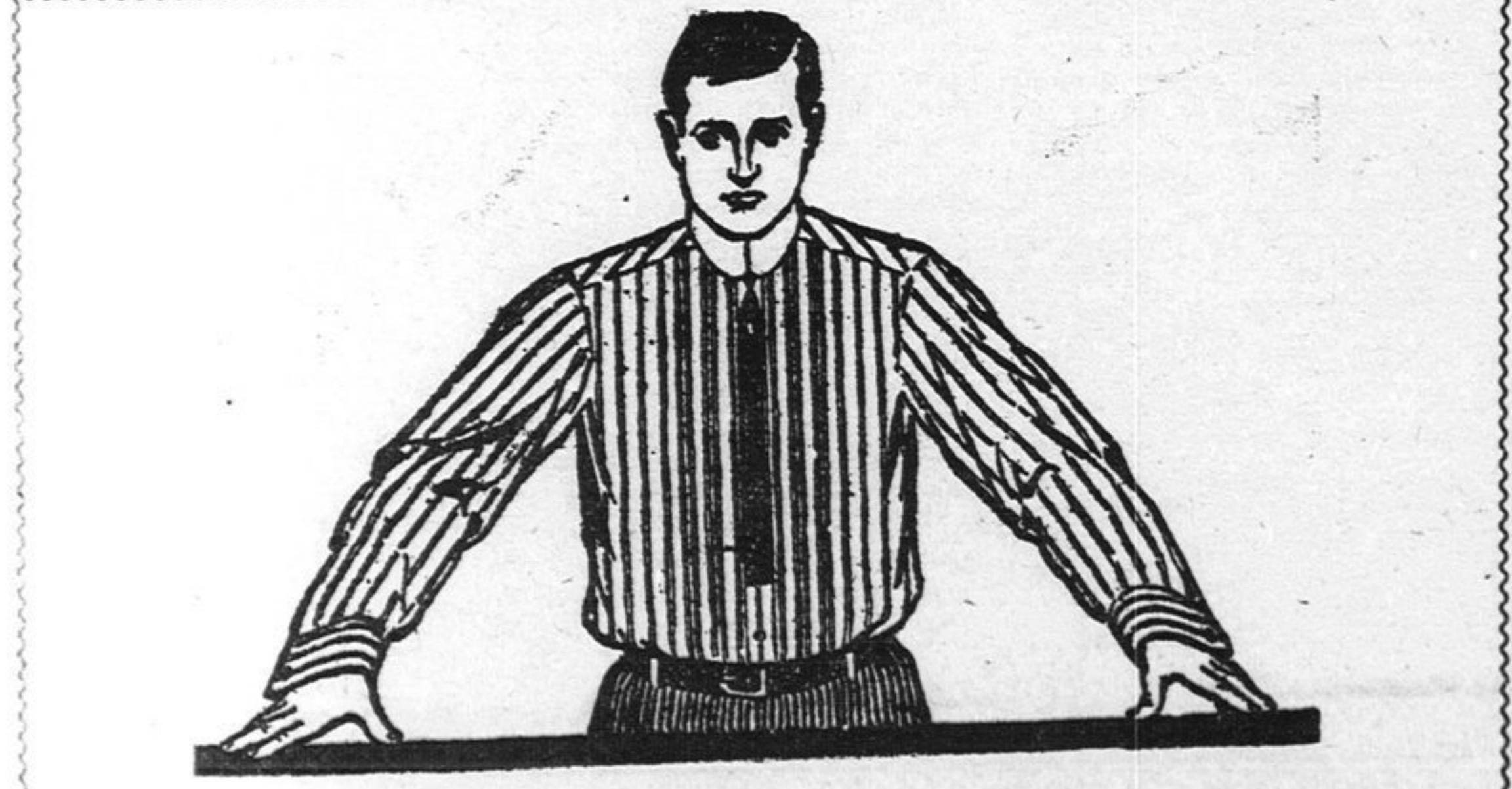
